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III Flaws of education System in Pakistan.

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The education system of Pakistan is generally divided into different levels. Article 25-A, right to education, the State shall provide free and compulsory education to all children. There is a wide range of issues and concerns related to the teaching and learning setup. To improve the education system of Pakistan development of strategy and should solve the issues.

The education system of Pakistan is generally divided into four levels. In Pakistan, the education system adopted from colonial authorities has been described as one of the most underdeveloped in the world.

Primary (Grade one to grade 5) pre school education is designed for 3-5 years old usually consists of three stages (play group, nursery and KG)



After pre school, students go to the junior school for grade 1 to 5.

Elementary (grade six to grade eight). At middle level of education eight commonly examined subject, Mathematics, English, Urdu, Islamiyat, Pakistan Study, Computer, Arabic, Science, Art and Craft. At middle level Single Sex education is usually preferred, but Co-education is also common in urban cities.

High / secondary level (grade 9 to 10) The students pass the exam by BISE (Board of Intermediate and Secondary education) practiced for the science students, where the lack of equipments and also teachers are not trained properly.

Higher Secondary level (grade 11 to grade 12). Intermediate level usually divided into two category i.e engineering and Medical. Arts and Commerce also be considered.



Education is the simple process of learning. Home is called the first school of children but the formal education starts from the school.

The teachers in government schools are not well trained. The students are not getting jobs in other sectors, they try their luck in education system.

The lack of technical education is the biggest flaw in the education policy.

The allocation of funds is very low. It should be around 7% of the total GDP.

Poverty is also another factor. Parents are not sending their child in public and private schools. They send their children to madras, where the education is totally free.
