The iceberg warning from other vessels were either dismissed or inadequately communicated to the bridge. The ship also lacked sufficient dinghies, as aesthetic concerns and overconfidence in its unsinkable design took precedence over passenger safety. Resultantly, such haste in completing the voyage and set to sail for the very first time led to an inconvenience which was seen by the whole world and still seen as the biggest casualty in sea, with no borders.
