Elaborate the concept of Ijtihad and its principles.

**DEFINITION OF IJTIHAD :**

The word Ijtihad is derived from the Arabic root s-h-d, meaning to strive or exert force. In Islamic jurisprudence, it is defined as:

The process of making a legal decision based on the logical independent reasoning that are not explicitly mentioned or derived from Quran and Sunnah.

The group of people who are the part of this decision-making body are called Mujtahids. Ijtihad enables to adapt to the changing world trends and upcoming challenges.

**IMPORTANCE OF IJTIHAD :**

The rulings based on the independent reasonings that are not explicitly stated in primary sources primarily is ijtihad, having its own vast significance.

## PRINCIPLES OF IJTIHAD :

### 1. Adherence to Sources

The foremost and significant principle of performing ijtihad is to consult from the authentic and primary sources of Islamic law (Quran and Sunnah).

The decision or interpretations must adhere to these, avoiding personal biased opinions and focus to particular school of thought.

## 2. Focus on Social Justice

Ijtihad emphasizes that the rulings must be from Quran and Sunnah, aligning to the basic mode of promoting social justice, in order to avoid conflicts and extremism. It must take a moderate route that would be in the interests of whole community.

## 3. Flexible and Adaptable

The premise of ijihad is that it is flexible according to the emerging trends and challenges, it can be changed. Secondly, viewing the contemporary world dynamics the need for a scholarly decision is required. As the Islamic financial system is based on the product of ijihad.

## 4. Contextual Significance

The reason, history and the background events must be brought to focus while performing

ijtihad. The knowledgeable expertise must perform. This role who have sufficient information about Islamic jurisprudence and the content of revelation of any commandment of Allah in the Holy Quran.

As during the caliphate of Uthman, he laid down the principles of accountability and while compilation of Quran, he consulted the people of sound memory and having the knowledge of local context of a certain aspect.

### 5. Facilitating Consensus

Mujtahids must reach the consensus on emerging issues, fostering unity, strength and enriching the scope of the Islamic jurisprudence, leading to the diverse levels of public opinion.

Hazrat Ali was known for his wide knowledge of Islamic jurisprudence. His letters to governors illustrates the principles of promoting equity and justice, good governance,

accountability and making mutual consultations from knowledgeable scholars on certain matter before final decision.

## 6. Practical Application

Hazrat Umar was known for his system of accountability and good governance, strictly aligning with the teachings of Quran and Sunnah.

Hazrat Umar established public welfare and accountability system to ensure the fair and practical application of Ijtihad.

## CONCLUSION TO IJTHAD

Ijtihad holds significance in the modern world with its deep roots dated back from the period of Hazrat Abu-Bakr. It is the practice of formulating Shariah, pertaining to an issue, for which ruling is not found in primary sources.

Ijtihad is regarded as

The need and importance is clear  
during the Time of Holy Prophet:

When Prophet returned from battle  
of Ahzab, he said, "None should  
offer Asar but at Bani Suraya".  
But for some it became due

intention of Prophet was not  
what formers had understood.

And when that was told to  
Him, he did not blame anyone  
of them.

## HUMAN RIGHTS IN ISLAM :

Human rights at the basic  
refers to the universal, moral  
and legal norms protecting the  
individuals dignity, liberty and the  
basic necessities of human life.

Islam gave mankind all the essential human rights rooted deeply in the belief of oneness of God, who is the Giver and the Sustainer. They are the integral part of Islam that are guaranteed equally to men and women but before the advent of Islam, women were highly deprived of their rights and were subjected to inhumane treatment. As clearly mentioned in Quran;

"And when one of them is given the news of female infant, their faces darken and chokes with grief. He hide himself from people as given a bad news. Shall he keep it in humiliation or turn it into dust." Surah - An Nahl

## STATUS OF WOMEN IN ISLAM :

The status of women in Islam is quite evident from the fact that

## A PLACE OF UTMOST HONOR AND DIGNITY.

The Holy Quran is also the living example that talks explicitly about the rights of women. Allah Almighty has dedicated whole chapter to women surah An-Nisa (chapter 4: The Women). It provides comprehensive guidance on women's rights from time of birth to death, the responsibilities, and role within the domains of family life, community or state level.

## SIGNIFICANCE FROM HIS FAREWELL PILGRIMAGE

The general respect and rights of women were given with the spread of Islam but Holy Prophet's Farewell Pilgrimage speech where he mentioned to be gentle with women, it elevates their status. Holy Prophet commanded:

Give you thanks to Me and your parents, all will return to Me."

### AS WIFE

When a women marries, her status is changed to wife. Nikkah gives very significant position to woman and it is considered as half of deen.

AS SISTER

"And if parents leaves  
neither ascendant nor dec.  
but has brother or a  
sister, then each one of  
them is a sixth. But if  
more than two, they share  
a third..... This is an  
order from Allah and He  
is All-Knowing and Forbearing."

## **DIGNITY OF MANKIND :**

### **LITERAL MEANING OF DIGNITY**

The word dignity, in Arabic is often called as karamah, which means honor, respect and nobility. Literally, it denotes a state of being honored, encompassing the moral, spiritual and social aspects of human life.

Human dignity lies in being endowed with reason and free will, which distinguish man from other creations and make him responsible for his actions. (Imam Ghazali)

### **DIGNITY OF MANKIND FROM**

The concept of human kind dignity is central to the teachings of Islam. Human beings are endowed with inherent dignity, regardless of

any discrimination. Holy Quran focuses on intrinsic values and guaranteed respect to all humans.

## PRINCIPLES OF DIGNITY IN ISLAM

### 1. Dignity : A Divine Endowment

All human beings are very much honored simply because they are the creation of Allah, and He created mankind in the best possible way.

We created man in the best of stature.

(95:4)

### 2. Mankind : Superior Creation

Humans are the only creation that is superior of Allah (SWT).

He calls them as 'Ashraf-ul-Makhloqat', the superior of all.

### 3. Man as vicegerents of Allah

Islam regards mankind as the vicegerents of Allah on earth, elevating his status and by enlivening peace, justice and the natural order. In Al-Baqarah, Allah says:

Indeed, I am going to place a successive authority on earth.

(2:30)

### 4. Angels to bow to Adam

The angels were commanded to bow to Adam as a signatory of respect and honor of mankind. Among all, Iblis refused to prostrate in pride and arrogance.

We said to the angels,  
'Prostrate before Adam',  
they did. Except for Iblis.

(2:34)

### 5. Highest purpose of creation

Allah (swt) created angels, jinn from fire and mankind from dust. The sole purpose of creation was to

Obey His all commandments.

I did not create jinn  
and humans except to  
worship me.

(Zariat : 56)




Shariah refers to the shared norms and principles derived from certain set of rulings.

It is in the same script and words as was revealed at its time without any changes because it is the word of God and He himself took its responsibility.


## IJMA - CONSENSUS
