INTRODUCTION:

The unequal capabilities of states result in the formation of poles. Since the disintegration of USSR, the global order has been based on unipolarity. The United States existed as a single superpower, the sole hegemon of the world.

Recently, certain dents - economic and strategic have declined the influence of United States. Concurrently, China has grabbed the opportunity to takeover global markets. Expansionist Putin put-up his decade agenda and emerging multipolarity began.

(1) MAIN TRIGGERS OF MULTIPOLARITY:

(3) Economic Setbacks of WOT:

When USA was focused in pursuing its offensive realist agendas and creating weapons and bombs, China got the much needed breathing space to set-up industry and seize markets vacated or unattended by USA.

China has used its population as a strength and driven on a economy-focused growth model.

(4) Construct of WMDs & loss of credibility:

It was a propaganda to remove Saddam Hussain.

Numerous instances, extra-territorial interventions have resulted in other members of International System to lose credibility in the hegemon.

It has superseeded its powers and created insecurity.

(5) Failure of Financial Institutions ~ Great Depression:

Post ww-II, the International Financial Institutions were headed by United States. After the failure of League of Nations, this system guaranteed economic stability.

Unfortunately, 2007-2008 marked a recession in Europe that soon translated to "Great Depression".

The decline in industrial growth, destabilized global markets and Dollar Rate Fluctuations; all contributed to loss of states in USA.

(6) BRICS: Challenge to G-7:

Russia and China collaborated with India, Brazil

(7) Russian Rise under Realist Putin:

The Russian President, Mr Putin is a true "offensive realist". He operates on the notion of 'Might is Right' and is focused on weaponisation of Russia. This reiterates the arms Race and leads to Security dilemma.

(8) Multipolarity: Myth or Reality?

It is pertinent that United States still remains the leading economy (\$26 Trillion) and security/military power.

Not to mention the sovereign recognition of a hegemon that it attracts. But involving in Russia and Gaza all at once, China's economic rise and Russian revisionist ideas; the global order is not stable.

INTRODUCTION:

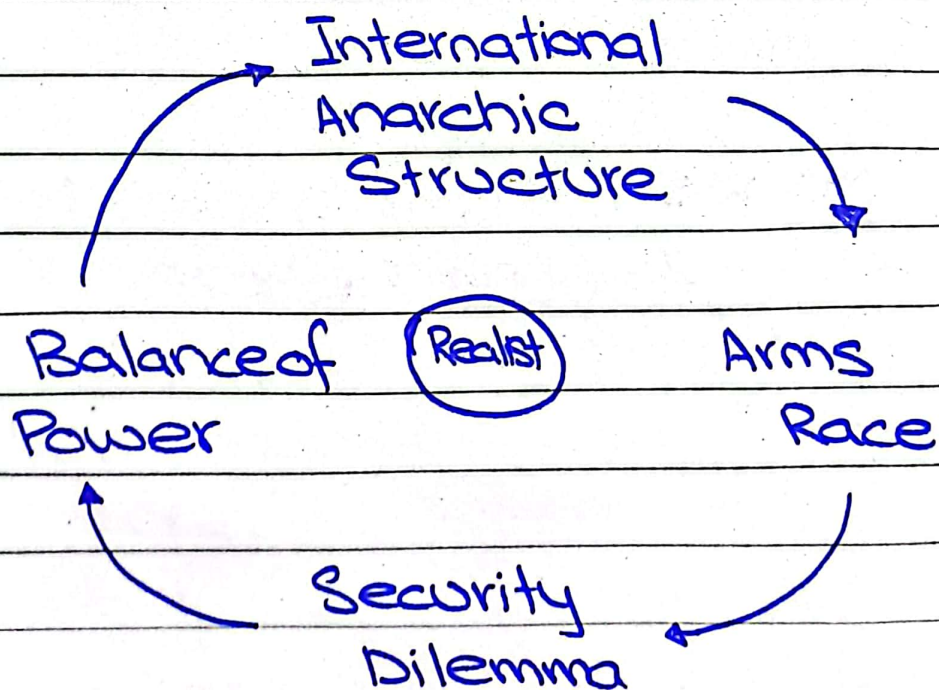

(4) Liberal Ukraine:

UN AND Genocide in

(1) Insight to UN's Purpose:

United Nations came into being on 25th October 1945. It was a global institution aimed at promoting and ensuring peace all over the world, discussing key agendas and resorting to non-violent punishments using the Security Council Resolution Mechanism.

(2) UN's Failure: Genocide in Gaza:

The scenario of the world's Middle-East in particular post 7 October 2023 has been nothing short of war. There have been grave violations of "UN Charter" and Principles laid under it.

2.1: Sovereignty of Territory:

UN failed to protect the sanctity and territorial sovereignty of the Gaza Strip, Lebanon and even West Bank.

2.2: Human Rights Breaches:

What occurred in Gaza was genocide. Nobody was exempted. Children attacked, civilians bombed. Tunnels that were shelter areas were burned.

No food supply or water availability prevailed. All hospitals and universities have been exploded. Pregnant women were raped. The worst Human Rights crushing was witnessed but United Nations chose silence.

2.3: UN SC Resolution Vetoed by USA:

The organisational structure of UN is such a flawed one that when South Africa filed a case against Israel and it got majority vote to be passed as a resolution, USA; the global leader of Human Rights vetoed it and it went to drain! There is no bigger failure than "veto" in UN structure.

2.4: Non-Binding Ruling of ICJ:

Similar to the exemption of Putin, the Israeli Prime Minister Netanyahu remains free even after being declared a culprit of Human Rights violation by ICJ, the supposedly Highest Organ to uphold Justice in the world.

(3) Inefficient International Law:

The base of UN Charter is the International Law. It has terribly failed in Gaza-Hamas Conflict.

The following elements of Law failed:

- 1- International Law of War (IHL)
- 2- International Human Rights Law.
- 3- Geneva Conventions.

This is not the first time UN failed. It failed in protecting Iraqis and Afghans back in the years 2001 and 2003; it failed during genocide in Burma and it continues its legacy of failure.

(4) Recommended Reforms for UN.

Considering the life of inhabitants of 193 countries, UN must bring necessary reforms (both structural and agenda based) to ensure the lack of future failures.

ANSWER: 2 POST WW-I ISSUES

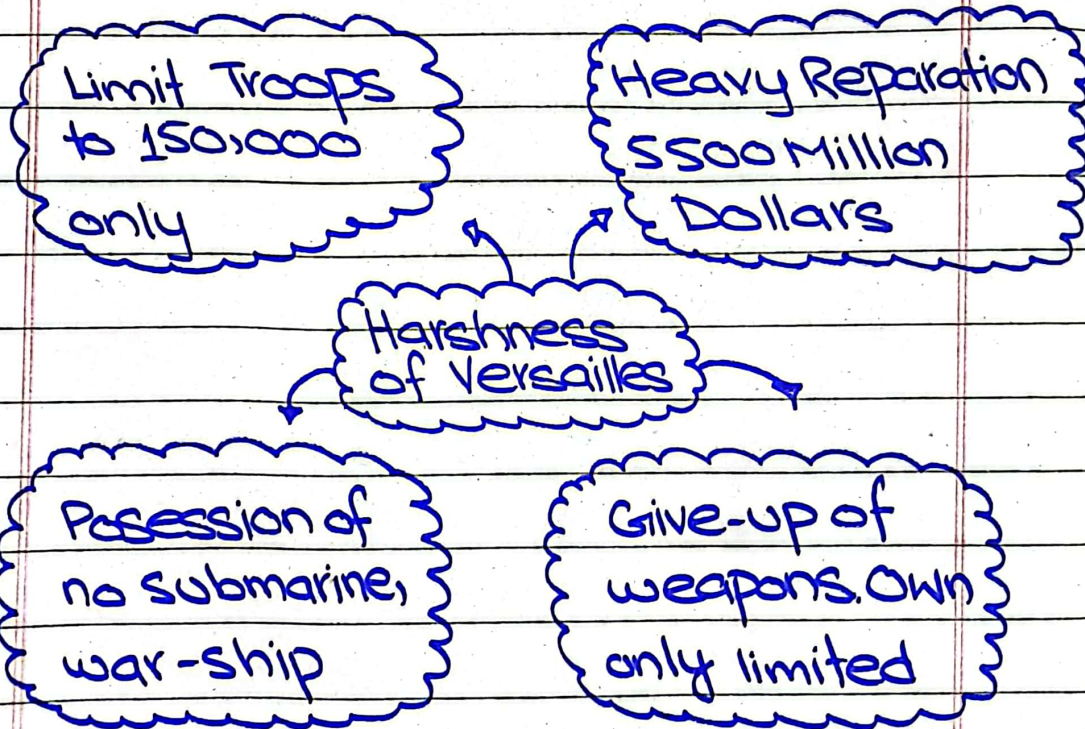
Introduction:

The First World War ended in 1919 when the allied powers turned victorious against the central powers. It was followed by the creation of "League of Nations", the first ever flagbearer of liberal global institutionalism. Certain injustices like Versailles Treaty and the "over-Westernization of the world." British policy of splendid isolationism also left hegemonic vacuum in Europe.

The interwar period (1919-1938) were marked by various territorial changes that resulted in WW-II.

(1) Treaty of Versailles: Realist View:

The most harsh treaty of Versailles was imposed on Germany. The treaty had such clauses as to cripple the existence of Germany.



In the realist perspective Versailles ended German participation in arms race hence, disrupting the entire European Balance of Power.

(2) Territorial Shifts:

It also marked the return of Alsace Lorraine to France. The Balkan states were independent and so was Poland.

Power over territory that Germans possessed was crushed and they were diplomatically isolated from the rest of Europe.

(3) League of Nations Failed:

United States and major states refused to take part in the league of nations. Under "Hegemonic Stability Theory", there was no over-arching power to carry course of League so it failed and chaos reemerged.

(4) Economic Isolation:

Another significant cause of ww-II was that European intra-state trade was not smooth or well-administered.

Under lens of "economic liberalism", it was this economic isolation and lack of interdependence that caused chaos and turned ww-II.

(5) Great Depression:

What worsened the scenario further was global great depression of 1930s.

Neo-Marxist Economic Order prevailed. The core states survived but the periphery collapsed due to Paul Prebisch's Dependency Theory. ~~The~~ The economic vulnerability caused inclination

towards violence.

(6) Rise of Fascist Ideology ~ Classical Realist View:

In Italy, emerged Fascism. Mussolini, Garibaldi were realists at the core.

They were immoral and ego-driven. The sole idea was centred on maximization of power.

(7) Critical Lens ~ resurgence of German Nationalism:

Germany was devastated to say the least. Their leaders particularly the hardcore realist Hitler and his Nazi Ideology (Anschluss) combined with his hatred for Jews (competitive nature) instilled a vision into the

Germans. It united them under the umbrella of Pan-German Nationalism or Nazism.
