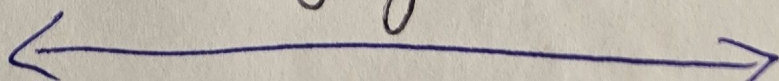
joys and keep searching for bigger successes. But when we ~~listen~~ to our heart, we realize that real happiness lies in the things that can be achieved easily.
