





Gindle-Based Violine Gurder-Based Violence (6134) signs to harmful acts directed at individuals based on their gender. Forms & Gender-Based Violence Domestic Violence: Domestic violence encompasses physical, emotional or sexual abuse inflicted by a postner or family membro. It involves appealed instances of abuse, which can have sever long-term effects on the surovivor's mental and physical heath. For wample, physical assaults may include slapping or chocking while emotional abuse can involve constant bitling or threats. According to the Human Rights Commission of Pakiston, around 70.1. of women expositive some form of domestic vidence during their Melime, but may cases go unaposted due to pas of setaliation. Bexnal Violence : Sexual violence muludes any sixual act or attempt to obtain a sixual at through violonce. Examples include sape, sexual assault and havoassmint in both public and private settings. The Aurat Foundation seponts that sexual Violance is alasmingly powelint
