What is the difference between culture and civilization? Highlight important features of Islamic civilization?

Introduction:

The word 'culture' is derived from an Arabic word (تربى) and also known as the 'tahzib'. And which means 'to tip', to 'grow'. In other words culture means 'an environment to grow'. Similarly, there is a word 'tamadun' which is used for the 'civilization'. The contextual meaning of civilization is 'the growth of a place or society to the advanced state.'

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Difference between culture and civilization

The main difference between the culture and civilization is explain by the metaphor that: "culture is the spirit while the civilization is the whole body".

Culture:

Culture refers to the traditions, norms, moral aspects of a particular society or a region.

The individuals of that society live according to the culture.

Their culture may include lifestyle, clothing, infrastructure, ethnicity.

Example:

In Islamic culture women wear hijab, veil all over the world. Similarly, the architecture, calligraphy skills are the part of Islamic

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culture.

Civilization:

Civilization refers to 'the growth of a society to the advancement of its societal, political and economical status.'

Civilization involves religious and materialistic factors. Some of the civilizations based on religions, but some only give importance to the worldly things.

Different civilizations had been cultivated in different eras.

Some of them are:

1- Persian Civilization was a Zoroastrian civilization. They were 'Fire worshippers' and had gone astray from the path of the nature.

2- Egyptian Civilization is considered as the 'oldest civilization', In which the

king himself was 'God'. They were called 'Pharaohs'.

3- Arab Jahiliyah (Period of ignorance) Civilization:

Before Prophet (SAW), the Arabs were standing on the verge of chaos. Their ancestors were followed the religion of 'Ibrahim (A.S)' but later on ebed away and they started 'idol worshipping'.

4- Western Civilization:

It totally deprived of the spiritual and moral aspects and based on the worldly race of advancement and modernity. That's why Iqbal said

Your civilization will commit
suicide with its own dagger
The nest built on frail bough
will be undurable.

5 - Islamic Civilization :

Islamic civilization is based on the religion which emphasize the spiritual and moral aspects of life. It not only binds individual to the Divine spirit but also gives an equilibrium between the worldly and bodily needs and religion.

Islamic civilization started with the rise of the Prophethood of beloved Prophet (SAW). As first Kalima says

“ لا اله الا الله في رسول الله ”

There is no God but Allah,
Muhammad (SAW) is His Prophet.

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Important Features of Islamic Civilization

Islamic civilization possesses unique features which other civilizations are devoid of.

Following are the some important features of the Islamic civilization.

1- Touheed (Monotheism):

Touheed, the Oneness of God, is the foremost feature of the Islamic civilization. The one who is part of Islamic civilization must proclaim monotheism and should have firm belief on Touheed.

"Say, Allah is the One, Allah the Eternal Refuge, He neither begets nor born, And there is no other equivalent to Him" (Surah Ikhlas)

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2- Prophethood of Muhammad (SAW) :

In Islamic civilization, everyone has to follow the footsteps of Prophet (SAW) and the 'Shariah' and 'Sunnah' he has presented to us. The life of Prophet (SAW) provides a complete guidance and he is the beacon of light for all of us. As Iqbal said

عقل پیش کن مصطفیٰ

Surrender your wisdom
before Mustafa (SAW).

3- Concept of the Hereafter :

Concept of hereafter (Akhira) is the only feature of Islamic civilization. Other civilizations have the concept of ~~eternal~~ life and or they believe that after death there is nothing. But, Islamic civilization has

inculcate the concept of 'Akhirah' in individuals through which the idea of reward and punishment, warning and cautions, hell and heaven has emerged. As the Quran also tells about hereafter

ملك يوم الدين

Sovereign of the Day of Recompense.

(Surah Al-Fatiha)

4- Rights And Duties :-

Only the Islamic civilization bounds individuals to perform their duties and fulfill the rights of others. The duties of one person is ultimately the rights of the other and vice versa. So, Islamic civilization defines the rights of parents, children, neighbors, teachers, relatives and even

of the animals. As Prophet (SAW) said; its explanation and context is

Everyone will be questioned for his responsibilities, either he has performed it or not, on the day of judgement.

5- Moral Aspects:

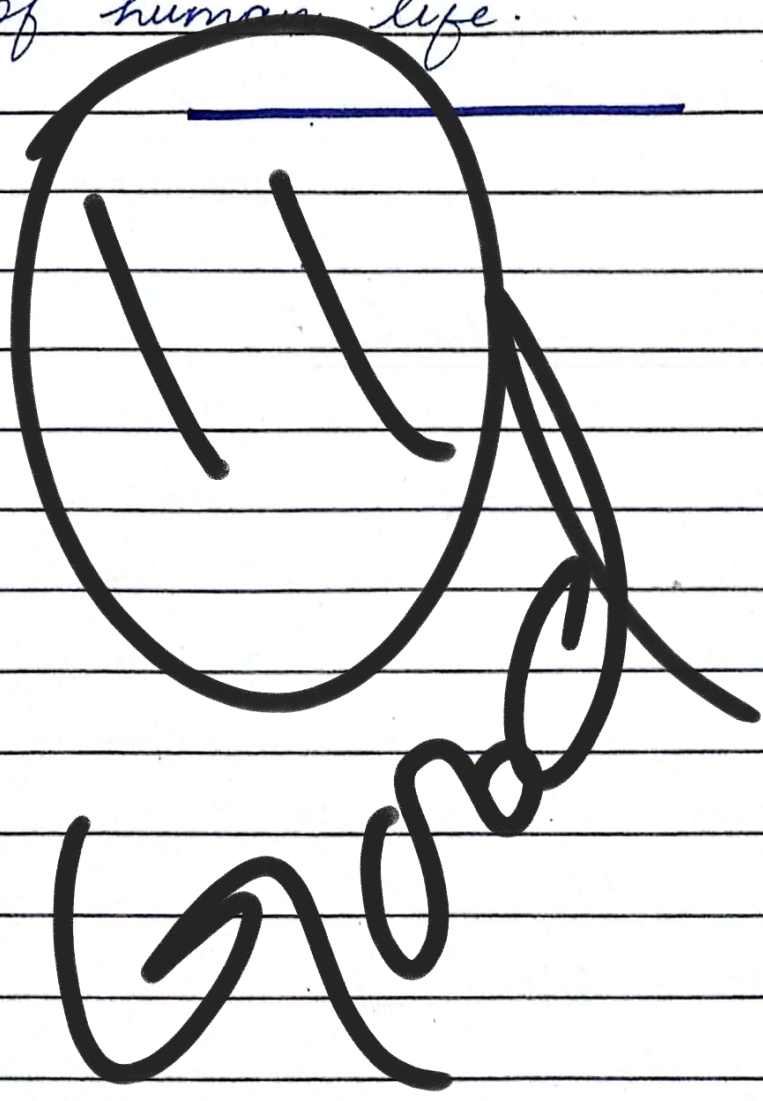
