Fasting in Islam

1 Introduction:

2 Meaning of Fasting:

i) Literal Meaning: Fasting in Islam is referred by the arabic word 'Sawm', which means 'to abstain' or 'to stop'.

ii) Contextual Meaning: In Islam fasting means to abstain from eating, drinking and sexual intercourse from dusk till dawn during the month of 'Ramadan'.

3 Importance of Fasting in Islam:

i) Importance According to Quran:
In Quran, Allah emphasizes Muslims to observe fasting.

ii) Annual Arab Retreat:

iv) Night of Al-Qadr:

Night of Al-Qadr falls in this month. Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) stressed upon observing fasting and praying in this month. The night of Al-Qadr is a special gift of Allah to Muslims. Prophet Muhammad (PBUH)

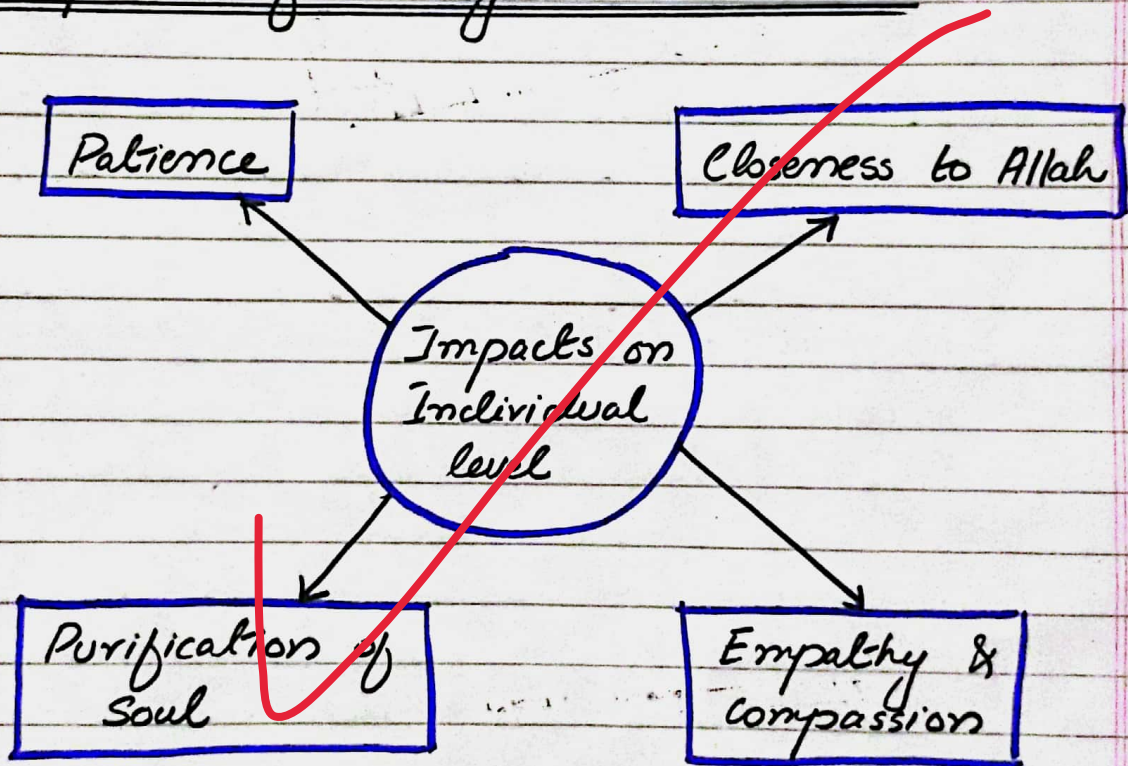

4 Conditions of Fasting:
