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"We will eat grass but we shall make atomic bomb". These words of Zulfikar Ali Bhutto are still alive after more than fifty years of them being said. This one sentence perfectly shows how one can achieve any goal, no matter how big or difficult it is, if one is ready to put hardwork and can sacrifice for that achievement. After more 25 years of that Pakistan emerged on the globe as first muslim nuclear state and proved that if you can dream it, you can achieve it. The world is full of such examples where an individual, a group or a country achieved crazy dreams just because they dared to dream and worked for it. In every field of the world be it science, sports, geostrategy, geosecurity or development of a war torn country one will find examples of achieving seemingly unachievable goals. Everything is possible if one stays focused, put hardwork, ready to sacrifice and have a solid reason to achieve something. If one looks back at anything, it had started from just a dream, a thought and an idea.

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Success does not happen in one day and it does not come until one works for it. There are several factors needed ~~to~~ to achieve a goal; a dream, hardwork, unmatched passion, sacrifice and consistency. Every dream that has been turned into reality always have these above mentioned factors. The process of achieving any goal is not always quick. There are no shortcuts. In order to turn any dream into reality one needs to ~~and~~ plan it smartly and work on it effectively. It takes sleepless nights, sweat and blood to achieve bigger goals. But when scientific societies read Einstein's work it blew their minds.

The work of Einstein led the foundation of modern physics. He later was awarded with Noble prize in physics. His achievements prove that if you can dream it, you can achieve it. Another inspiring example is of Madam Curie who was working on radioactivity. While living in the patriarchal society she defied the norms of the society. While working on radio active isotopes she personally got cancer and later on died due to that. But her selfless work in the field of radioactivity she was also rewarded with Noble prize in the field of chemistry and became the first female scientist to achieve noble prize and proved that if you can dream it, you can achieve it.

The poet of east, thinker of Pakistan, Allama Iqbal saw a dream for the separate independent homeland for the Muslims of sub-continent. When he shared his dream in his Allahabad address of All India Muslim League it seemed like a distant dream, something almost impossible to achieve, keeping in view the circumstances of United India at that time. Muslims were in minority, they were deprived of their rights. The Hindu majority was never ready to give Muslims their freedom. Everything was against Muslims of India but one thing, that was their dream, their passion for freedom and for separate homeland - Muslims ran strong movements, gathered more people, spread awareness and within 10 years of Allahabad address Muslim League passed the famous LAHORE RESOLUTION on 23rd March 1940. Quaid-e-Azam through his exemplary leadership and determination got Muslims their separate homeland. It was never an easy thing to achieve but the dream of Iqbal, struggle of Muslim freedom fighters and leadership of Jinnah ~~was~~ achieved Pakistan on 14th August 1947 and proved that if you can dream it, you can achieve it.

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Even in the sports arena Pakistan and Pakistanis have achieved a lot of success just because they saw a dream and believed that they can achieve it against all odds. Cricket World Cup 1992 is the supreme example of turning dreams into reality. The skipper, Imran Khan^{got} retired from cricket before 1992 but was brought back to the team as captain by then president Zia-ul-Haq to win the world cup for Pakistan. Pakistan was not looking good on paper as it was playing without its premier fast bowler Waqar Younis and opener Saeed Anwar. Pakistan lost a few matches in the start but they batted themselves and ended up winning the world cup just because they saw a dream and were hungry to achieve that. Another example of the great achievement is Arshad Nadeem winning gold-medal in olympics for Pakistan even after training in sub-normal conditions and without much financial support from the sports board. It shows how a dream can move mountains if you are passionate enough for it. Recently, Sana Mir, the former captain of Pakistan women cricket team was included in ICC Hall of Fame. The first women cricketer to achieve this milestone. Even though she hails from a society where

women do not get equal opportunities, her feat is an inspiring story to tell to the generations to come. It depicts how one can achieve big milestones if they dare to dream big.

Nuclearization of Pakistan is another story which proves how one can achieve crazy and ~~even~~ seemingly unattainable goals even with minimal resources. After India became a nuclear state in 1970s, it was imperative for Pakistan to go nuclear in order to protect the sovereignty of the country. Pakistan had no choice other than making an atomic bomb for the purpose of deterrence. Pakistan was financially weak and diplomatically isolated ~~after~~ but still dreamed for the nuclear weapon for the sake of its existence. Pakistan did not fall for any of this and became first Muslim nuclear weapon state on 28th May 1998. It is a story of remarkable success against all odds, a story that proves that anything is achievable in this world if one dreams for it. The story of resilience of Pakistan in order to achieve atomic bomb has no any parallel, it is a story of turning dream into reality.
