Answer: 4 India's move to unilaterally abrogate the Indus water treaty (IWT) signals a serious shift in South Asian water politics. The treaty brokered by the World Bank in 1960 was a rare symbol of cooperation between India and Pakistan.

Its collapse increases the risk of water based conflict in the region, especially given Pakistan's heavy reliance on the Indus River for agriculture and drinking water.

At the same time, China's plan to construct the world's largest dam on the Brahmaputra river near Arunachal Pradesh (claimed by both China and India) raises strategic and environmental concerns for both India and Bangladesh.

It gives China significant control over water flows, which could be used as a geopolitical tool during conflicts.

Introduction : Pakistan and India after facing conflicts, often turn to diplomacy to reduce tensions. These diplomatic efforts are important for regional peace and stability.

Post-Conflict Diplomatic drivers :

① **Ceasefire Restoration** : Both sides usually agree to maintain the 2003 line of control (LoC) ceasefire through military hotlines and mutual understanding.

② **Confidence building Measure (CBMs)** : Includes releases of prisoners, opening religious routes like Kartarpur Corridor, and easing visa policies.

③ **Trade Revival** : Limited trade is sometime resumed, helping both economies and promoting interdependence.

④ **Role of External powers** : Countries like the UAE or the U.S may quietly help start dialogue between both nations.

⑤ Challenges :

Political pressure, media hostility, and public sentiment often create hurdles in the peace process.

The U.S ~~tax~~ tariffs on Chinese goods, especially under the U.S China trade war, pose several challenges for China:

• Challenges :

• Reduced exports to the U.S, which is a major market.

• Disruption in global supply chains, especially in electronics and manufacturing.
