Allama Muhammad Iqbal, was the man who dreamt of a separate homeland for Muslims and planted that dream in the heart of Jinnah. Jinnah worked for it, but it was not a piece of cake. He faced British imperial resistance,~~

Congress dominance, Hindu-Muslim riots, and limited resources. Despite odd situations, he remained motivated and dedicated. Because of his efforts, Pakistan emerged on August 14, 1947. Hence, a collective dream, rooted in ideology, can break the shackles of imperialism.
