Furthermore, the economic empowerment of women through increased employment quotas, entrepreneurship support, and property rights is indispensable. Financial independence enhances their agency and self worth. Equally vital is ensuring a safe working environment, free from harassment, to encourage women's participation in public life.

Family and societal support also plays a pivotal role; positive involvement from husbands, in-laws and communities strengthens women's confidence and mobility. Early and forced marriages, which hinder women's personal growth, must be eradicated through legislation and strict enforcement.
