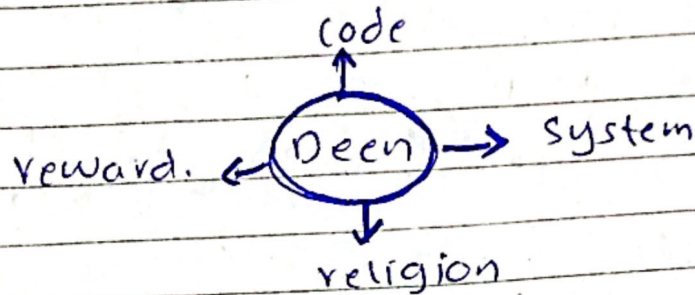

Deen literally refers to:

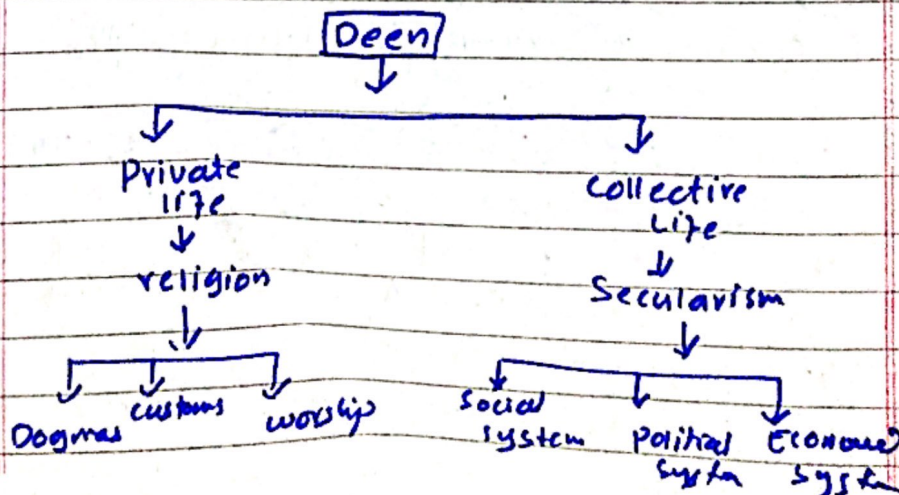


• Concept of Deen:

3- HIGHLIGHTING RELIGION AND ITS FEATURES:

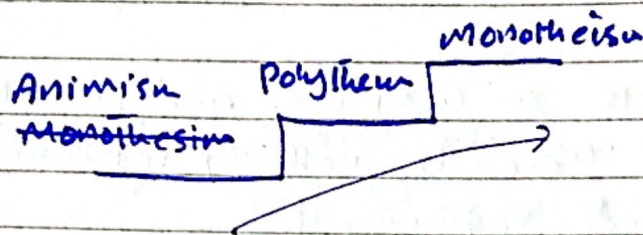
(a) Meaning and Nature:

5- IMPORTANCE OF DEEN IN HUMAN LIFE:

(a) Pathways to Righteousness:

"ومن يتبع غير الإسلام ديناً فلن يقبل منه
وفي الآخرة من الخاسرين"

"And whosoever comes with any religion other than Islam will not

be accepted from him and he, in the Hereafter, will be among losers."

(Al-Imran)

Deen guides human towards the path of righteousness.

(b) Closeness to the Creator:

"إِذَا بَلَغَ الْإِنْسَانُ لَحْظَيْنِ الْقُلُوبِ"

"Indeed, with the remembrance of Allah hearts rest."

Deen, not like other religion, presents complex rituals to follow but simply describes the clear path to become close to the Allah.

(c) Teach Mercy, humility and kindness:

Deen inculcate sense of mercy, humility, and kindness towards others to promote peaceful co-existence.

"وَإِنْ جَاءَ السَّلَامُ فَاجْعَلْ لَهَا دُخُولًا عَلَى اللَّهِ"

If they incline to peace, then you too do so, as rely on Allah."

(d) Source of knowledge and superiority:

Deen promotes knowledge and discourages unhealthy practices to burn body, worship idols and promote biases. However Deen believes in inclusive, sustainable and equitable society.

” يَا أَيُّهَا الَّذِينَ آمَنُوا أَطِيعُوا اللَّهَ وَأَطِيعُوا الرَّسُولَ
وَأُولِي الْأَمْرِ مِنْكُمْ ”

” O, who have believed, obey Allah, and His messenger, and obey those who have authority among you.”

(e) Deen sabotages inequality and endorses equality in all spheres:

” إِنْ أَرَأَيْتُمْ عِنْدَ اللَّهِ الْقِيَمَ ”

” The only nobel from you in front of Allah is who is the most righteousness ”

This shows Deen does not label inequality, yet promotes equality of human.

2. DEFINING SHARIAH AND ITS COMPREHENSIVE SOURCES:

(a) Shariah: A Torch to Guide:

Shariah is referred to the set of instructions and recommendations of Allah placed before human to

Al-Ghazali:

Sources	Description
(i) Quran	• Quran is the last book Allah has revealed: • "ذَلِكَ الْكِتَابُ الْاَرِيبُ فِي"
(ii) Sunnah	• Prophet Muhammad's actions, attributes, speeches, and acts.
(iii) Ijtihad	• Ijtihad is use of intellect to infer ruling not explicit in Quran or sunnah.
(iv) Ijma	• Collective efforts to resolve shariah-related issues.
(v) Istishsar	- Mujtahid's preference best out of all.
(vi) Qiyas	- comparing latest issue with Quranic or sunnah's.
(vii) Urfo adat	- Daily practices of a society

3 - IMPORTANCE OF ISMA IN THE LIGHT OF QURAN AND SUNNAH:

(a) Ijma as a tool to keep Islamic teachings afresh; with the passage of time, various religious thoughts have

faded away due to weak position before latest challenges. However, Islam through Ijma helps people stay relevant and informed.

Example: Artificial Intelligence:

Today, Ijma can assist states to put ethical regulation on the use of AI.

(b) Ijma assists to meet global challenges of women inequality:

Islam prioritizes equity in gender. However, biological science has put women in a dangerous position due to their biological weakness.

Example: Ijma on women role in male-dominated societies:

Islamic concept of Ijma allows states to incorporate women in social, economic, and political sphere. For instance, Ijma on role can take examples of Hazrat Khadija (RA) and Hazrat Ayesha.

(c) To ensure accountability and Transparency:

Ijma can assist to elevate Social justice system by promoting Collective consensus on social evils and ensuring proportionate penalty to wrongdoers.

(d) promote consultation:

"والذين استجابوا لربهم وأقاموا الصلوة وآتوا الزكاة والفقرة والشرى
بينهم"

"And those who believe and responded to their Lord, establish Prayer and whose affair is determined through consultation"
(Shura)

Ijma promotes collective efforts to resolve latest challenges and threats.

Example:

Cloning and test tubes babies need Ijma and a collective consensus on it to ensure moral well-being of Society.

(c) Resolving social evils: and ensure justice:

"ان الله يامر بالعدل والاحسان"

Indeed, Allah commands justice and excellence."

Ijma plays a vital role in alleviating social issues, including poverty, inequality, and immorality.

Example: Ijma on Zakat system in a state:

Ijma on a framework of Zakat system, end of riba, and resolution of hoarding help state meet the challenges.

- Lack of quality muftahid

 - Social media's role to make people expose to insensitive content
 - Absence of Islamic unity.

Political System

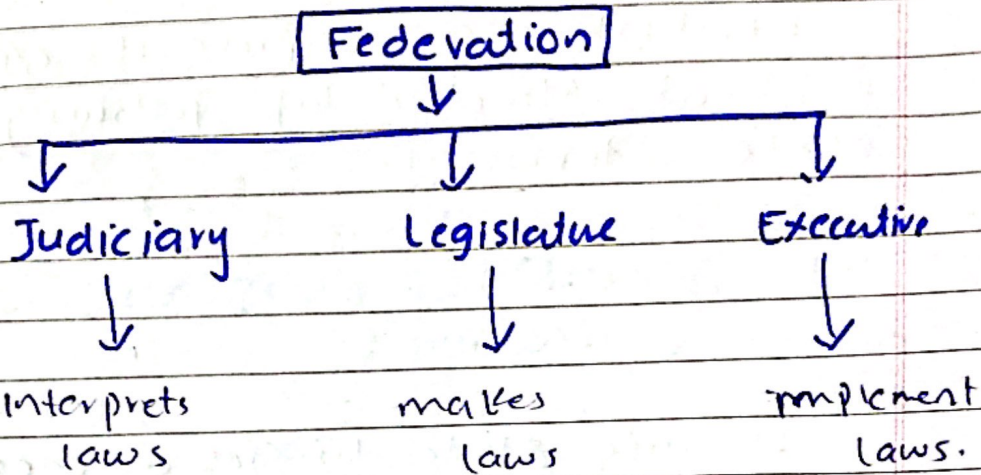
1. Introduction:

2. Understanding current Political Structure of Pakistan and its challenges:

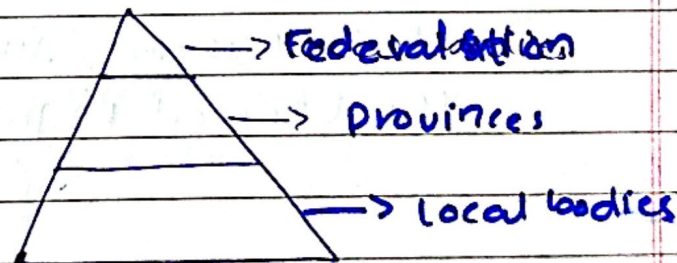
First, understand the Political system of Pakistan.

Riba is a poison, corroding morality in a state. Prophet Muhammad (P.B.U.H.) clearly declared that Riba must not be an Islamic State's feature.

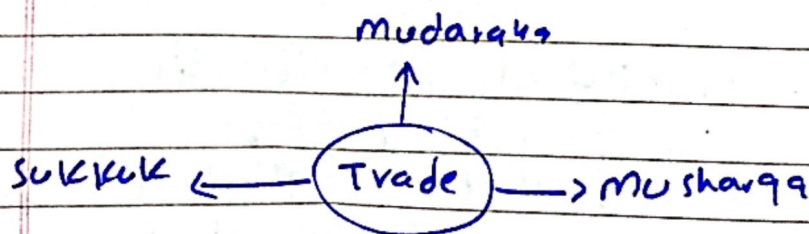
"واحل البيع وحرم الربا"

Women Rights

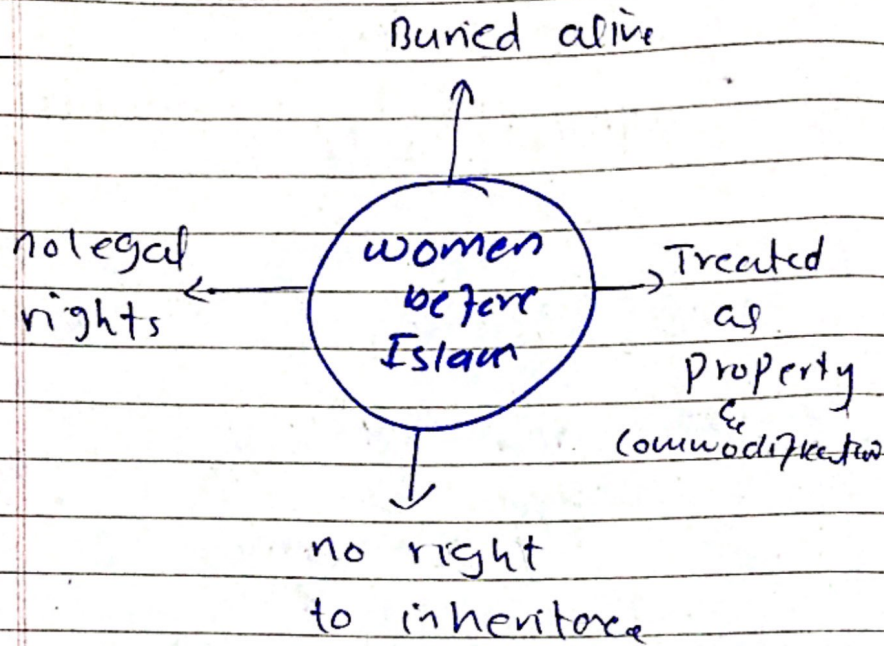
1. Introduction :

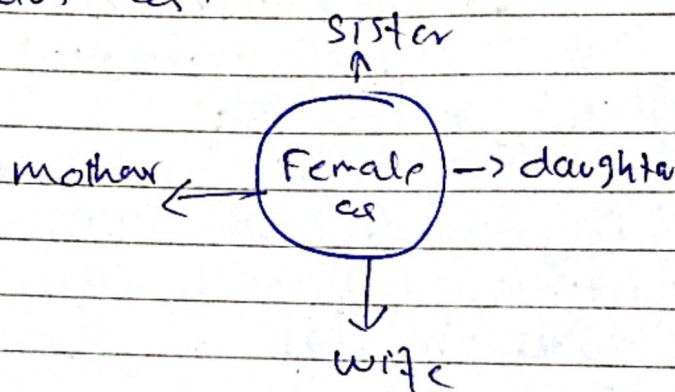
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Example: Women March in France
