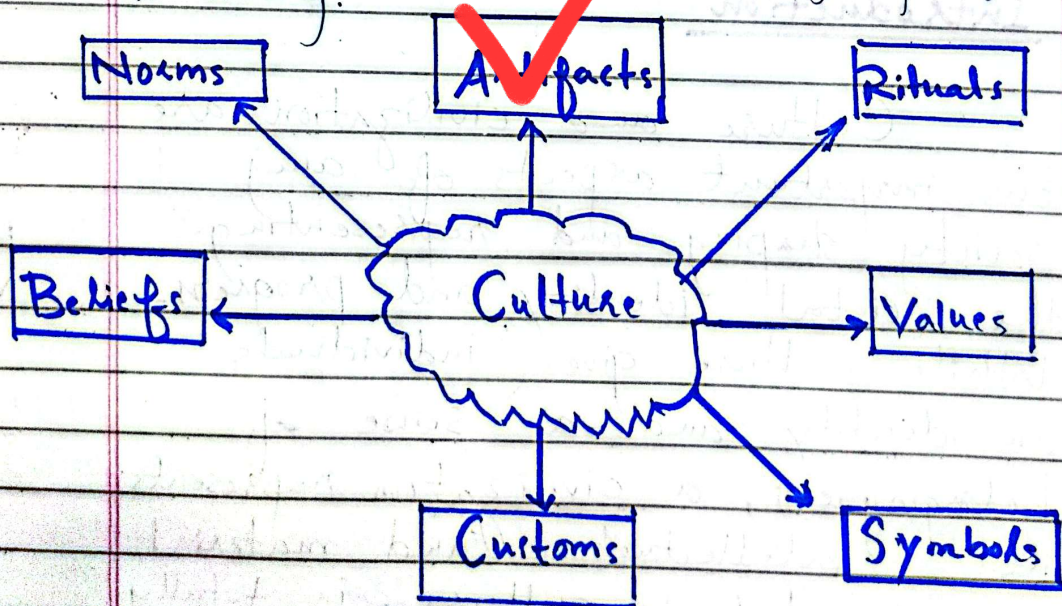
1. Introduction

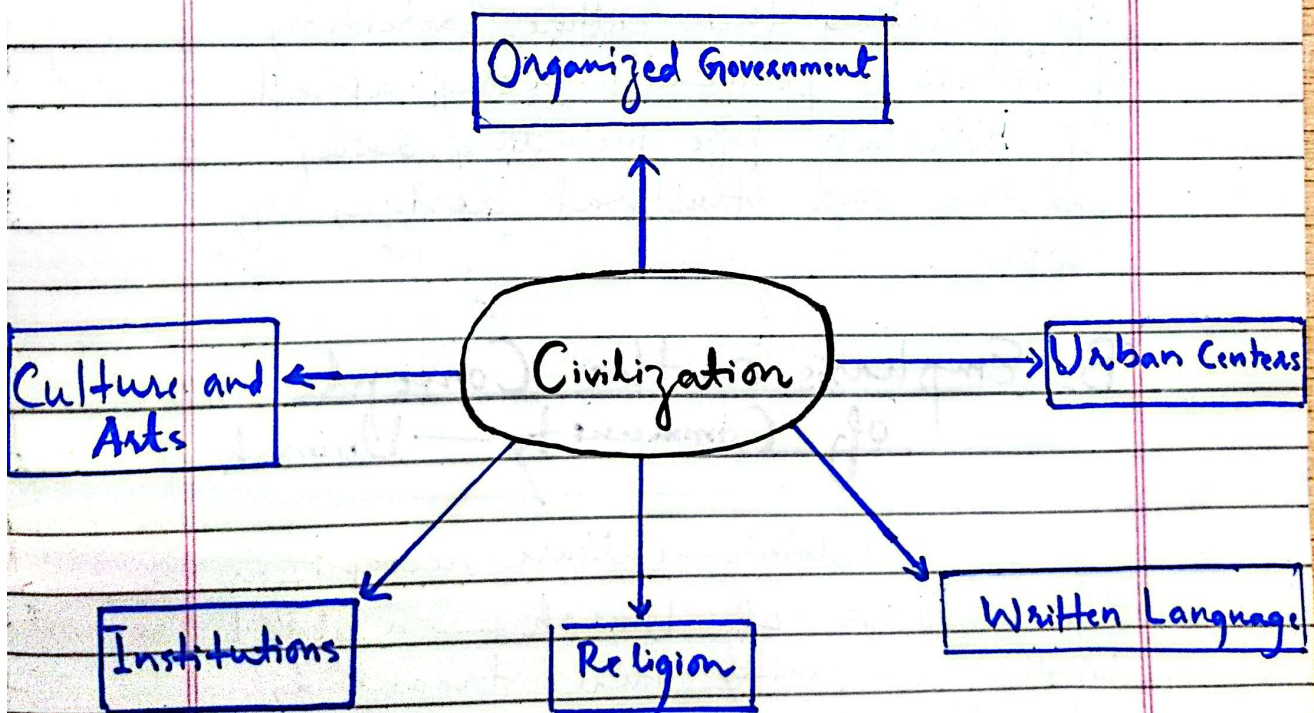
II. Defining the Concept of Culture

IV. Characteristics of Islamic Culture

A. Centrality of Tawheed

For instance, Islamic laws or diet prescribe the halal dietary principles in a Muslim society and the modest dress codes such as Hijab for women—all are derived from Quranic guidance or the teachings of Hadis.

D. Integration of Faith and Daily Life

Faith has been integrated in all aspects of life in a Muslim society. This includes business

ethics in market to dressing style and rituals.

E. Emphasis on Family and Social Structure

Islamic culture lays great emphasis on a close-knit family ties and calls for strengthening relations among families and relatives. It also requires Muslims to form stronger bonds with spouses, parents, siblings etc.

F. Artistic and Aesthetic Sensibility

Islamic culture celebrates beauty (Ihsan) in all forms. This can be seen in elaborate designs of mosques and the Arabic calligraphy.

Islamic culture focuses on values of integrity, social justice, humility, and equity. It prescribes moral values for all aspects of life.
