While sticking to "the book" and carrying out plans using conventional knowledge can ensure loss minimization, however, truly innovative and 'out of the box' ideas require one to challenge the conventional norms, and to have confidence in one's wisdom.

3(5) From the reaction of Dexter's rivals to this achievement, it can be inferred that human beings assume a strategic, well-thought out, consequential plan to be 'genius'. While a plan that apparently relies on luck or confidence is perceived to be 'foolish'.



Similarly, the human aversion to risk-taking implies that a risky venture is foolish, while if the gains at the end <sup>can</sup> be predicted and ensured to a degree, then that plan is hailed as genius. An importance to the end, rather than the means, can be inferred from this perception-dichotomy.
