Introduction:

Pakistan has been in vicious cycle of political instability and constitutional crisis since its inception. The multitude of factors such as leadership crisis, demographic issues and linguistic divide etc had never allow Pakistan's political system to run smooth. Moreover, civil-military relations were always strained, ultimately result in military coups, weakening democratic spirit of new born state. However, after 1999, there was a ray of hope for democratic stability in Pakistan, later in the form of 2008 elections. The same political reforms and constitutional developments put the trajectory of democracy on right path.

Historical Overview of Political System of Pakistan: Before 1999

(i) Suspension of Constitutions:

The constitutions of Pakistan have suspended thrice in 1958, 1962, 1973. This was blow to spirit of democracy. The military leadership had suspended constitution for power gain.

(ii) Military Coups:

Pakistan had faced military coups cumulatively for thirty years. The strained civil-military relationship resulted in weakening of political culture in Pakistan.

→ Evolution of Political system and culture after 1999

After 1999, Pakistan's political system and culture have seen ray of hope in restoration of democracy in the form of emergence of printing media, general election and many more. Following are the evolution processes and factors.

(i) The Liberal Autocrat: Musharraf Regime

General Musharraf after dismissal of Nawaz Sharif's government came in power. He took following steps in his regime.

(a) Legal Framework Order 2002

This Legal Framework Order 2002 was a set of amendments in 1973 constitution to increase presidential powers such as dissolving of National Assembly.

(b) Referendum 2002

Under the Legal Framework Order, the referendum in 2002 took place. Gen. Musharraf declared himself as Chief Executive.

(c) Emergence of Print Media

In Musharraf regime, there was emergence of printing media on national horizon.

(d) Movement of Restoration of Judiciary

The movement of ^{restoration of} judiciary was observed in Musharraf regime. It was lead by lawyers, political party of Nawaz Sharif. This movement was set back to Musharraf regime.

(e) 17th Amendment: December 2003

In Musharraf regime, 17th ammendment was passed to reverse 13th ammendment. Under this ammendment, ~~Art 58(2b)~~ was added back into 1973 constitution and gave authority to president.

(f) Devolution of Power to Lower Levels:

Musharraf regime introduced devolution plan 2000. Under this plan, the power of DMG had reduced and power ~~was~~ transferred to local tiers of government.

(ii) Charter of Democracy:

In 2006, Benazir Bhutto and Nawaz Sharif had signed Charter of Democracy in London with the aim of restoring democracy in Pakistan.

(iii) Election - 2008

After long tenure of Gen Musharraf, the elections were held in 2008. In the election, Pakistan Peoples Party won and made government.

(iv) 18th Amendment: The Dawn of Democracy

In 2010, the National Assembly of Pakistan had passed the 18th Amendment. It was a major constitutional amendment in which half of articles of constitution amended.

This amendment curtails the powers of president and gives power to provinces.

It also stopped the way of any military adventure by adding article 6(A) and removing 58(2b). Therefore, it is pertinent to say that the passing of 18th ammendment is a good omen for democracy.

(v) Smooth Transition of Powers

The first time in political history of Pakistan, the government (2008-13) completed its tenure. It has lead to stability of democracy. After that, general elections was held and government came with peoples will.

(vi) 26th Ammendment: The Constitutional Ammendment

The latest ammendment passed in 2024 was 26th ammendment. It has made the judicial appointments politically. as parliamentarians and judiciary will mutually decide appointment of Chief Justice.

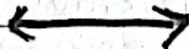
Critical Analysis:

The creation of Pakistan is not a single event process but it is a multi-evolutionary process and different events and factors aided in its creation. The basis of demand of Pakistan was Two Nation Theory. Allama Iqbal provided philosophical explanation and Quaid-e-Azam turned it into political reality. The events such as Aligarh Congress, Ministries and Lahore Resolution had monumental role in creation of Pakistan. These events had subtle effects on Muslims of United India and gathered them under the idea of Two Nation Theory in more practical way.

→ Key Social Ideologies Between 1930-1947:

Following are the key social ideologies between 1930-1947.

(i) The Two Nation Theory

This was the most influential theory in the United India. According to this theory, Muslims and Hindus were two separate nation by any definition. The culture, religion, food, history etc made two nations distinct to each other in every way.

(ii) Composite Nationalism

Composite Nationalism was alternative theory to reject Two Nation Theory. This theory advocated for united India under British rule.

* This theory was supported by Khan Abdul Ghaffar Khan and Moulana Azad prominently.

Allabad Address - 1930 :

Allama Iqbal was a supporter of United India in initial day. Later, he was in favour of separate Muslim homeland. He presented his idea of separate homeland in 1930 at Allabad.

"I want to see the Punjab, NWFP, Sindh and West in one homogenous state. Whether India get independence or not under the crown of England or without it, I think independent state of western province is the destiny of people living there."

This address of Iqbal was influential in Pakistan Movement as it was the first time Muslims got the idea of separate homeland. It encouraged

them to speed up their efforts for creation of Pakistan. The idea of a separate homeland was infused into Muslims of United India by Iqbal.

→ Congress Ministries-1937-1939

(i) An overview of Congress Ministries

Congress Ministries were won by Congress in selection of 1937. Congress made the provincial governments in 8 provinces. The result of 1937 election was shocking for Muslims as winning of Muslims were restricted to only Muslim majority areas.

(ii) Activities of Congress Ministries

After coming into power, Congress had started its anti-Muslim activities and policies against Muslims such as

- (a) Hosting of tricolour flag in schools and offices

- (b) Hindi was declared as national language
- (c) Vidyā Mandir scheme and Warda Taleemi scheme were launched which anti-Muslim in spirit.
- (d) Economic marginalization of Muslims in businesses.
- (e) Banning on slaughtering of cow.

All above mentioned atrocities of Congress ministries had compelled Muslims that without separate electorate, it would have impossible to gain power in legislature and they could never win elections in Muslim-minority provinces.

According to Jaswant Singh,

"The Congress tenure had tremendous shock for Quid-e-Azam.

→ Influence of Congress Ministries on Muslims

After the provincial elections of 1937 and policies of Congress ministries, Muslim League had realized;

* Congress is no more party of Muslims as it claimed to be national party of United India.

* Muslim League has failed to represent Muslim minorities areas.

* Muslim League confronted with a fact that the Hindu majority provinces would be ruled by Hindus but Muslim League would not represent largest provinces with Muslim majority such as Bengal and Punjab.

All above mentioned realizations compelled Quaid-e-Azam to speed up efforts and improvement loopholes of 1937 elections.

→ Lahore Resolution - 1940

Lahore Resolution acts as a Magna Carta in history of Pakistan

Movement. It was the last phase of struggle of Pakistan. Lahore Resolution was passed on 23rd March 1940 in Lahore, presided by Quaid-e-Azam. It impacted Pakistan Movement in a following way:

(i) Marked Beginning of Pakistan Movement

Lahore Resolution was marked as beginning of Pakistan Movement. It gave the formal acceptance to separate idea of homeland of Muslims.

The Hindu press called it "The Pakistan Resolution".

(ii) Safeguard of Identity

Lahore Resolution proved to be guard of identity of Pakistan by presenting idea of Pakistan. It had safeguarded interest of Muslim identity.

(iii) Proof of Two Nation Theory

The Lahore Resolution proved a Two Nation Theory that Hindus and Muslims are two separate nations.

(iv) A Sense of Identity for Muslims

Lahore Resolution, by presenting idea of Pakistan, infused sense of identity for Muslims as separate nation.

(v) Establishment of Islamic State and Protection of Muslim Culture

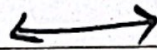
Lahore Resolution paved the idea for establishment of Islamic state with Islamic political system. Also, Lahore Resolution had protected Muslim culture in longer term and Urdu as a national language.

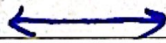
To sum it all, Pakistan and Afghanistan are in turmoil in terms

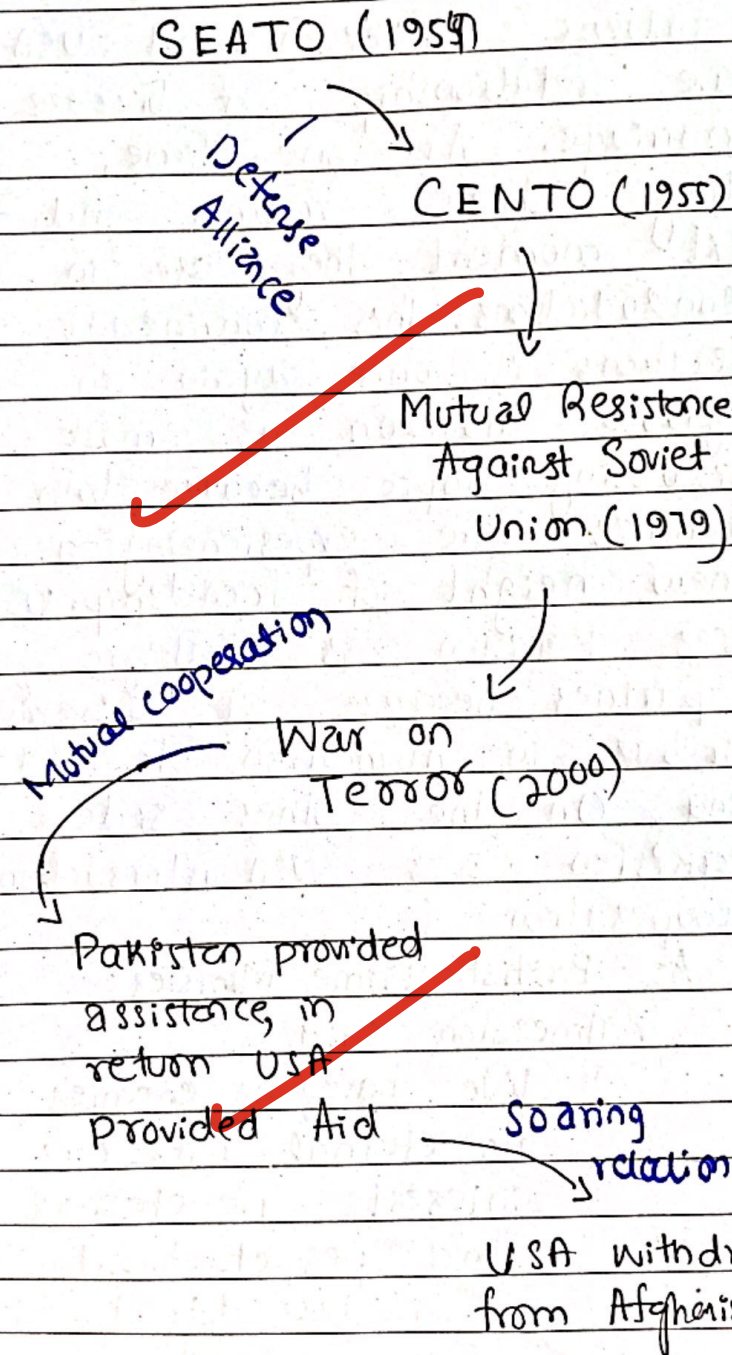

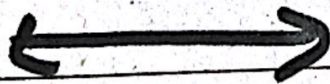
USA
