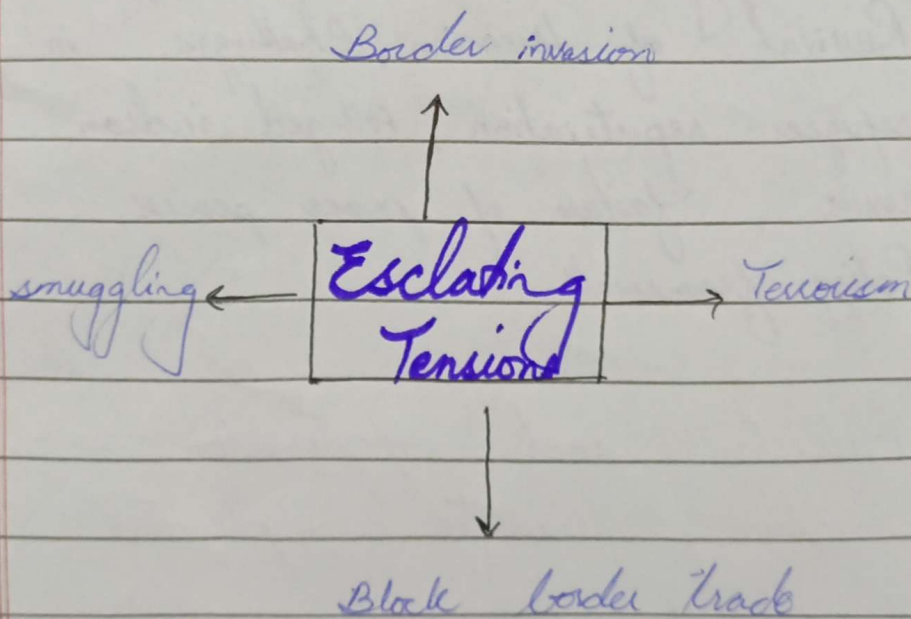
Question 2:-

Ans Pakistan and Afghanistan are
neighbouring country separated
by Durand line. There always
have been ups and downs in
relation due to Afghanistan
vulnerability. The crises ranged
from security risks to
threat to sovereignty.

1) Escalating Tensions in Pakistan and Afghanistan:-

After the withdraw of US army from Afghanistan in Feb 2021, tensions between Pakistan and Afghanistan raised day by day.



(i) Border invasion:-

There has been cross border tension between two countries in second half of year. The terrorist

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tried to invade Pakistan land with cover of Afghan army but Pakistan defeated them.

(ii) Terrorism:-

There has been resurgence of terrorist attack in Pakistan specially in KPK and Balochistan.

* 69 Terrorist attacks were made TTP in Quetta in 3 months of Sept-Nov.

(iii) Blocked border trade:-

The border trade between the two countries has been stopped that cause worse economic situation in Afghanistan but also damage Pakistan economy.

(iv) Smuggling :-

Pakistan has always faced economic challenges due to black economy and smuggling. The use of smuggling of

caused disruptions in economy of Pakistan.

(B) Revival of Terrorism:-

Pakistan Afghanistan tensions has spiked the terrorist attacks in Pakistan. The terrorist attacks not only cause disruption in economy but also security threat to sovereignty.

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(ii) ISPR Press Conference:-

The ISPR wing of Pakistan Army gave briefing on the terrorist attack in Pakistan in 2025.

- * Approximately 1800 attacks have been made in Pakistan by terrorist groups. Of these attacks 1400 attacks were done in KPK only.

(ii) Attacks on Train:-

Suddenly, the attacks on Jaffar express has been carried out frequently and twenty one passengers were captured.

(iii) Attack on Law enforcement and administration.

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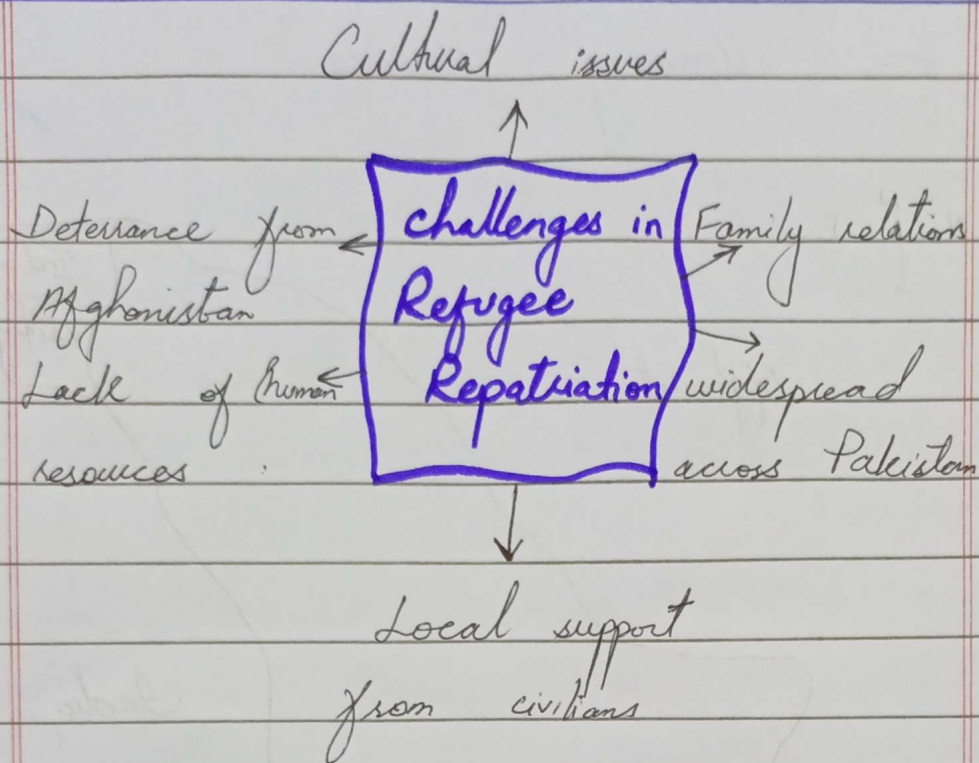
the attacks has been carried out on administration in Balochistan and killed the Assistant commissioner along with his driver. Law enforcement agencies officials were also martyred from different ranks.

with Afghanistan:**

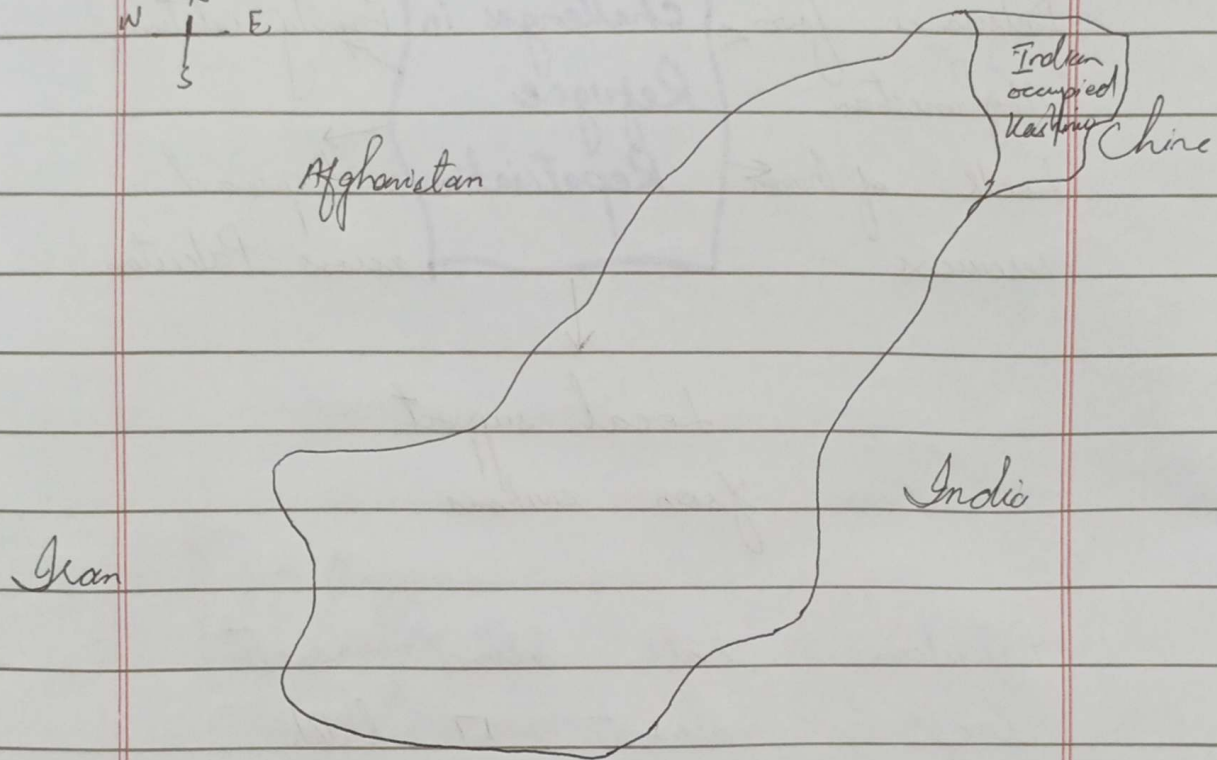
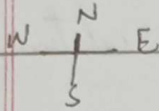
India is

- (vi) Fragile economy and smuggling
- (vii) Involving in proxy wars

relations :-

(i) History of Pakistan - USA
relation :-

India to counter China in
this region.

* Soviet Union War :-

Pakistan
supported the USA in
Soviet Union war. General
Zia and Saudi Arabia

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recruited the fighters called "Jahadi" and trained them. Pakistan did all this with financial and diplomatic support of USA for USA

* Pakistan and Afghan war :-
In Afghan war Pakistan supported the USA army through
(i) Logistic support
(ii) lend its Airbase
(iii) Withdraw its support from Taliban and Afghanistan.

(ii) Present Relation of Pakistan USA :-

In the second era of Trump regime, USA changed its attitude

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with Pakistan

- (i) USA imposed 29% tariff on Pakistan while 50% on India
- (ii) USA remained neutral in May 2025 conflict of Pakistan and India
- (iii) USA president, Trump meet Field Marshal General Asim Munir in personal one to one meeting.
- (iv) USA involved Pakistan in Gaza peace plan and thanks Pakistan for Peace nomination.
- (v) Both countries are extending its economic ties and trade

* Reko-Dig Project

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Pakistan invited the USA
to explore and mine the
minerals of Pakistan land.
Both countries sign agreement
of exploring and mining
of rare minerals.

(8) Shift reflects changing
dynamics of global order:-

This change of Pakistan
USA relation shifted the
perspective of Pakistan in
the region and global
order.

(i) Diplomatic relations with
other countries:-

The shift
of Pakistan USA relation
has strengthened the Pakistan

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ties with other countries.
The stability of Pakistan
in global south is strengthened
more. The investment and
trade with UAE, Qatar,
Saudi and European union
is enhanced.

(ii) Defense and Security

Sustainability:-

The defense and
deterrence of Pakistan is
strengthened as Pakistan
has signed the defense
weapon deal with USA.

- * US - F16 upgradation :- US
will fund \$686 million
to Pakistan for upgradation
of technology of F-16.
- * This will make defense

more resistant than earlier.

(iii) Economic Sustainability:-

The shift of Pakistan and USA has shifted the status of Pakistan economy from vulnerability to sustainability.

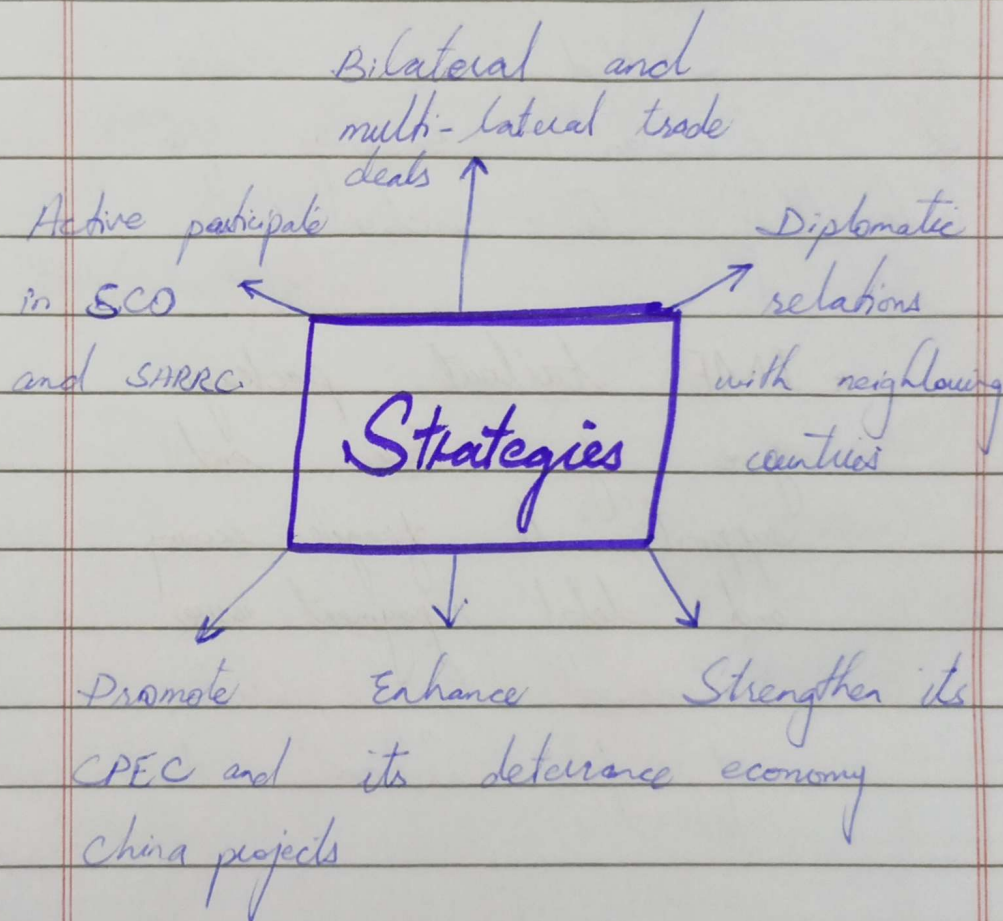
* IMF bailout package gave firm base and support to fragile economy and debt repayment issue. Extended Fund facility of \$ 7 billion.

Ans Pakistan India water issue settled through intervention of World bank and finalized agreement of Indus water treaty 1969. But recent defeat in May 2025, India unilaterally

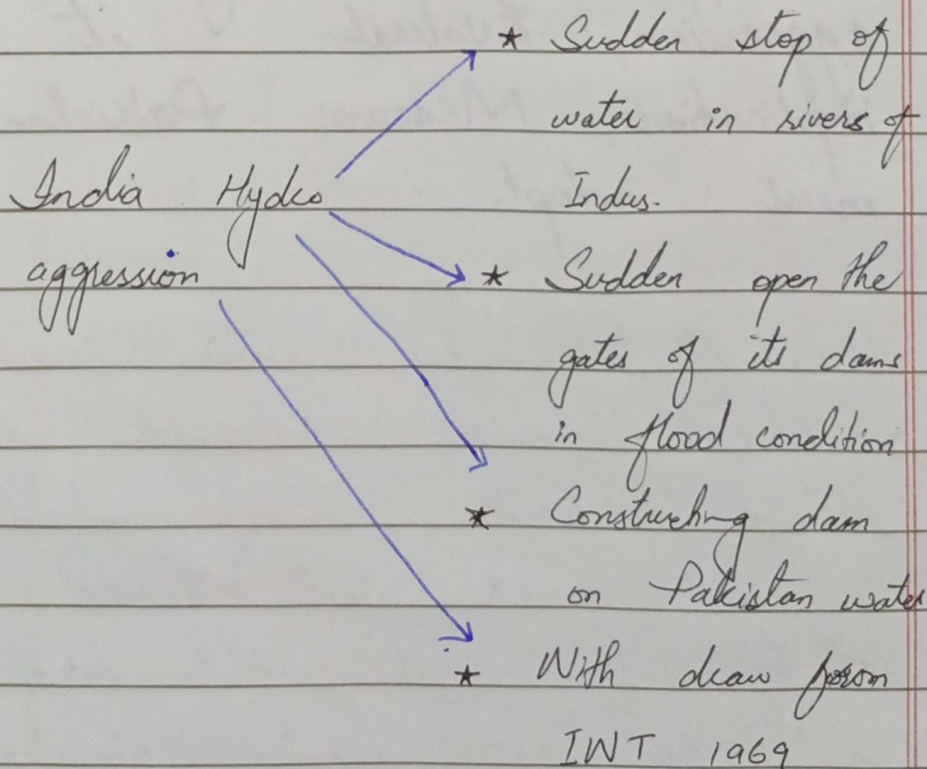
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stepped out from deal.

(iii) Agriculture Vulnerability:-

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Pakistan is an agricultural country whose GDP is dependent on agricultural production. It forms

Flood disaster:-

The aggression of water by India had created the disaster of flood in Pakistan and worsened the flood situation. In 2025 when floods hit Pakistan, India simultaneously opened water in all their western rivers.

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* 1.4 trillion rupees were lost
in 2025 flood.

* 3.6 million people were
displaced in Punjab only.

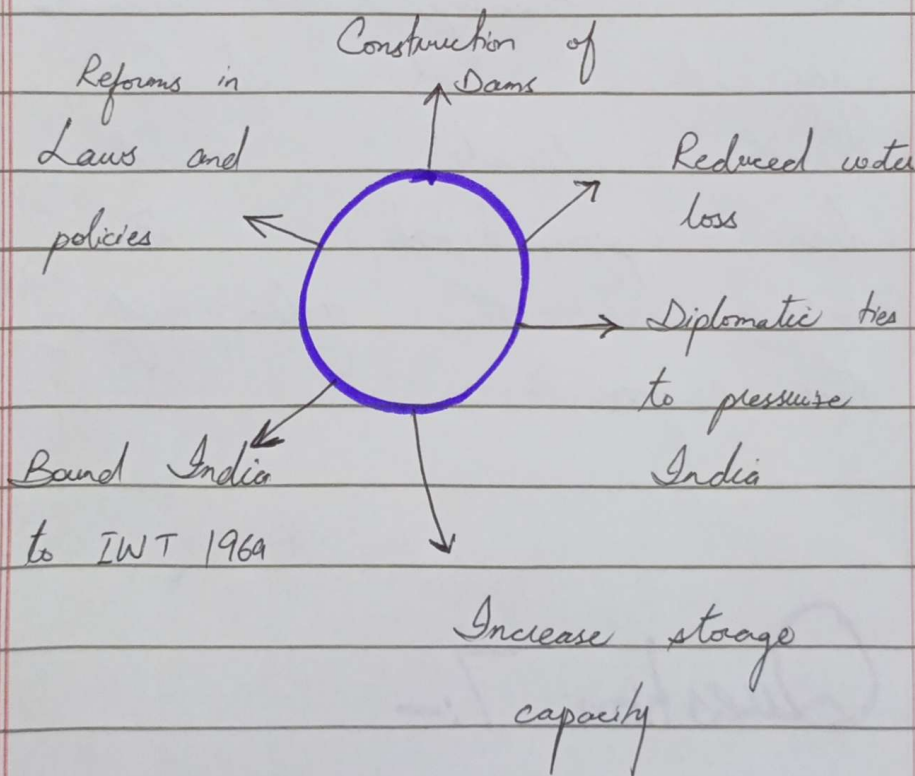
(v) Security and War Threat:-

The extremism and terrorism is dangerous tool that has created political instability by doing attacks on opponent or worse remarks about the opponent.

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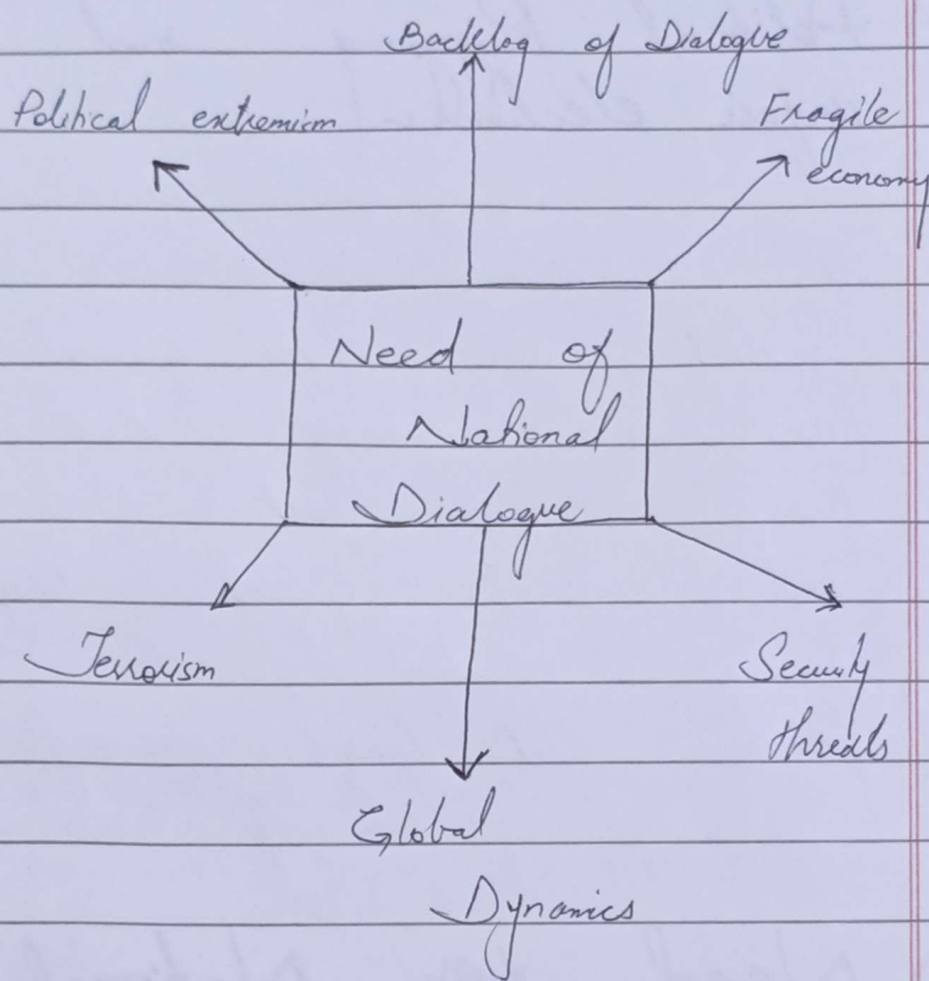
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(vii) Political Rigging and unfair elections.
