Comprehensive Understanding is Restricted
By Specialized Knowledge

The pursuit of specialized knowledge has hindered the thorough understanding of the world issues. A field specialist's world view is only limited to his narrow expertise. Different experts would define the same human differently, giving only the partial truth instead of whole reality. This tendency makes us unable to handle multidimensional crisis. Today, we have lost a single and comprehensive outlook on life matters which used to be the strength of Medieval thinkers. The dependence on expert advice has weakened our own common sense to manage everyday life affairs. It has transformed us into passive seekers of specialist's opinion. The specialized knowledge must not be shunned, rather redirected to build a broader understanding of life. Varient knowledge is needed to solve complex questions. Such knowledge must also be taught at educational institutions.
