Salat: (Prayers)

The literal meaning of Salat is to pray and contextually Salat means to humbly request or beg for something, to communicate.

The concept of Salat goes beyond a ritual act it is comprehensive system of worship and spiritual connection with Allah (swt).

Salah according to Quran:

In Quran Salah is meant to transform the personality and character rather than just an obligation.

In verse 29:45 of Quran, Allah says:

"Indeed prayer restrains from shameful and unjust deeds, and the remembrance of Allah is greater."

Salah keeps the believer constantly aware of Allah in daily life. In another verse of Quran, Allah says:

"Establish prayers for my remembrance" (20:14)

Salah according to Sunnah:

Sunnah of our beloved Prophet (saw) also emphasizes the importance of Salah.

It is considered as the most important and beautiful pillar of Islam from the five pillars. Also, it is meant to be the measure of person's faith.

There is a Hadith in Sunan-al-Tarmidhi,

Prophet (PBUH) said,

"The first matter that the servant will be brought to account for on the Day of Judgment is the prayer."

Also in Sahih-Muslim, there is another Hadith, Prophet (PBUH) said,

"Between a man and disbelief is abandoning prayer."

which means that neglecting Salah is considered as a grave punishment and spiritual danger.

Objectives of Prayers:

In Surah Ankaboot Verse (29:45) Allah says, "Recite what has been established to you of the Book and establish prayer. Indeed, prayer restrains from shameful and unjust deeds, and the remembrance of Allah is greater. And Allah knows what you do."

The objective of Salah in Islam are spiritual, moral, psychological and social. Prayer is meant to transform the individual and society but for that the condition of sincerity is must. Some objectives of Salah include:

;) Establishing Connection with Allah: (Tawhid)

The foremost objective of prayer is to create and maintain a direct relationship with Allah. Salah constantly renews servitude and affirms Allah's sovereignty. In verse 20:14 of Quran, Allah says,

"Establish prayer for my Remembrance."

Prayer keeps the believer mindful of Allah throughout the day which nurtures spiritual awareness and God-consciousness (Taqwa)

Moral and Ethical Reform:

A key Quranic objective of prayer is character development. True prayer shapes behaviour, discourages immorality, injustice and arrogance. It reflects in the following verse of Quran (29:45),

"Indeed, prayer restrains from shameful and unjust deeds."

Discipline and Time Management:

There is an obligation of prayers which is fixed time, which trains believers in punctuality, order, consistency and management. It creates a sense of discipline in person's personality.

In verse 4:103 of Quran Allah says,

"Indeed, prayer has been prescribed upon the believers at fixed times."

Prayer also aims to still humility, concentration and sincerity - *ikhshu*

It cultivates humility in person's character. Verse 23:1-2 of Quran also highlights the

benefit of *ikhshu*

"Successful indeed are the believers, those who have *ikhshu* in their prayers."

Spiritual Purification and forgiveness:

Prayer serves as a means of clearing sins and spiritual renewal. They are meant

to erase mistakes from soul and also their record of deeds. There is a hadith in Sahih Muslim relevant to it,

"The five daily prayers erase sins between them."

Impacts of Salah:

Salah functions as a reformative force for both individual and society. There are numerous impacts of Salah, some includes the following:

1) Spiritual Impact

Salah cleans the soul and wrong deeds of a person. It is meant to purify spirituality of a person and erase their sins. Secondly, it results in peace of mind and heart when a person bows in Sujud with full belief that he is prostrating in front of the creator of world and Akhirah, he automatically feels peace in his body. Moreover, Salah develops patience in individual's body. When the belief of the creator is in the mind and with the pure belief a person prostrates automatically and unthinkingly, person becomes patient. Furthermore, Salah also ~~also~~ makes a person close to Allah. Allah loves the person who ~~is close to Allah~~ in way and offers the obligation not on a burden but on ~~love~~ to gain love of Allah (SWT).

In verse 13:28 of Quran, Allah says,
"Verily, in remembrance of Allah do hearts find rest."

Moral Impact:

Salah has a moral effect on a person. It stops the person from doing internal and external wrongdoings. It helps in character building. Secondly, it creates humility and humbleness in person's character. It stops sin and vice. Moreover, it creates purity in a person. Thus, Salah reforms person's character and conduct.

In 29:45 of Quran, Allah says, "Indeed, prayer restrains from shameful and unjust deeds."

Collective Welfare:

Islamic civilization is community centered - It promotes solidarity by giving Zakah, charity and mutual care. Social institutions like zakah and charity systems promote equality and compassion. It creates

justice in society while ensuring stability, harmony and sustainability - mutual responsibility promotes social bonds and prevents class conflict and a just society ensures right, prevents exploitation and maintains peace - Islamic civilization remain dynamic because justice corrects imbalances and prevents decay. In verse 3:110 of Quran, Allah says, "You are the best community raised for mankind."

5) Accountability:

In Islamic civilization there is a sense of accountability which give moral depth. There is a belief in hereafter which ensures ethical continuity - Individuals are aware that actions have consequences beyond this world. This sense of accountability encourages long term planning, justice and responsible governance.

The verse 3:185 of Quran says:

"Every soul shall taste death, and you will be fully recompensed."

6) Universality:

Islam promotes universal brotherhood beyond race and geography. This enable inclusivity, interaction and coexistence. It promotes tolerance and dialogue among different cultures and faiths. It also allows interaction and mutual enrichment, making Islamic civilization globally relevant and

Islam has provided complete knowledge in every sphere of life therefore, Islamic social system also ensures that every individual is guided by the principles rooted in Quran and sunnah, and are provided the solutions to the challenges faced by modern civilizations such as inequality, injustice, corruption and moral decay.

Social Responsibilities of State in Islam:

The role of social system in Islam extends beyond law and order to ethical, social and educational duties. In Islam state has following duties:-

1. Protection of fundamental rights:

The state is responsible for protecting life, property and dignity of its citizens. This protection is universal, not just

limited to any particular group. It ensures security, trust in governance and enables citizens to live without fear. For example, in the time of Prophet (PBUH) citizens of different faiths and tribes were protected under the charter of Madinah.

Establishment of Justice: (Adl)

Justice is the most significant factor or principle of Islamic governance. The state must apply laws impartially and protect the weak from exploitation. Through justice equality prevails and society is free from corruption, oppression and social unrest. Justice creates sense of trust and social cohesion.

Prophet (PBUH) also said,

"The most beloved ^{to} Allah on the Day of Judgment is just ruler."

Promsion of Social welfare:

State is responsible for fulfilling the basic needs of everyone i.e. food, shelter, health care and education especially for the poor, orphans and widows. It is done through Zakah, Sadakah and waqf (endowment for public use). It reduces poverty, promotes social equity and strengthens communal solidarity.

Prophet (SAW) distributed Zakah among the poor, widows and disabled.

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4. Promotion of moral and ethical values:

Islamic state encourages virtues like honesty, humility, compassion and forbids dishonesty, injustice and corruption to ensure a morally upright society and strengthen discipline - Prophet (SAW) acted as a moral guide, correcting societal wrongs and promoting ethical behaviour. Quran also commands such behaviour in verse 3:104: "Command what is right and forbid what is wrong."

5) Protection of family:

Family is the fundamental unit of Islamic society and the state supports it by regulating child protection, inheritance and regulating marriages. It encourages strong family ties, social responsibility and generational continuity. Verse 46:15 of Quran states: "And we have enjoined upon man (care) for his parents."

6) Encouragement of Education:

State ensures easy access to knowledge and education - In Islam education is considered very important for every individual. Education is a vital source of learning to promote intellectual, spiritual and moral development for contributing fully in society - Quran

Solutions to modern challenges:

Islamic social principles are timeless, they are bound to benefit and gives relevancy for present and future generations of they are applied effectively, the modern day challenges can be addressed easily.

Solutions to Economic Challenges:

Economical challenges can be addressed through:

Reducing Economic Inequality:

Islamic mechanisms like Zakah, Sadqah and Waqf ensure wealth distribution on equal terms. These principles can inspire welfare programs, unemployment relief and healthcare for the poor. This reduces economic disparity, prevents social unrest and fosters economic stability. Prophet (PBUH) also established public funds to support poor, widows, orphans and disabled.

Combating Corruption and Injustice:

State enforces accountability for rulers and citizens, ensures transparency in administration and prevents corruption. In modern world there should be policies related to anti corruption and justice. There should be fair and ethical governance and judiciary to follow Islamic guidelines. During the

Caliphate of Hazrat Umar ibn-al-Khattab, officials were held strictly accountable for misuse of public resources.

These help in prevention of exploitation, promotes trust in institutions and ensures equal opportunities for all.

Solutions to Social Challenges:

The solution for social problem can be-

1. Ensuring Rule of Law:

The state must ensure laws are enforced fairly, without bias or favoritism, to maintain social balance. There should be transparency in judicial systems, access to justice for all and check on abuse of power. This prevents social unrest and maintains peaceful and stable society. The Prophet (PBUH) ensured that even his companions were accountable for their actions, demonstrating impartiality.

2. Promoting Education and Innovation:

Seeking knowledge is obligatory and encouraged for all. It is responsibility of state to give easy access to education.

The curriculum of schools, universities should be ~~more~~ modernize and vocational training and research programs should be encouraged alongside moral education. It creates an intelligent and productive society capable of solving modern challenges.

Resolving Issues through ethical principles:

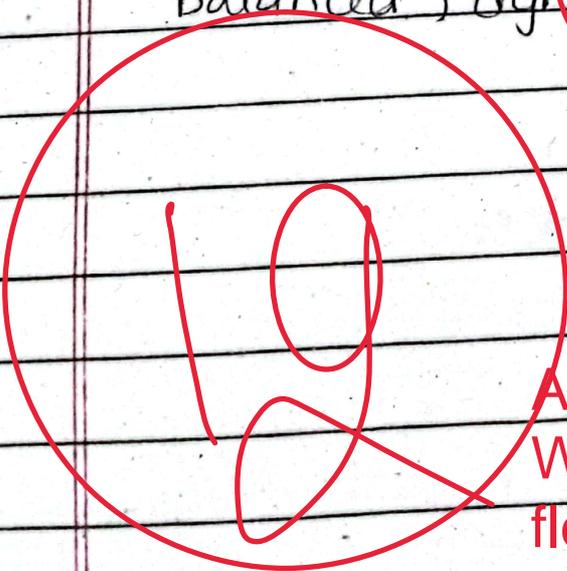
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There should be ethical business practices, laws regarding environmental protection and conflict resolution and programs related to global humanitarian aid. This will protect environment and address global issues ethically.
