Comprehension

Q1: The fundamental error which the author identifies is the misconception about the relationship between tradition and progress. The author says that the relationship between tradition and progress is seen as completely opposite and contrary, posing a threat to civilization. Traditions are often limited to the past events and considered obsolete and irrelevant, whereas progress is seen as dynamic. This dichotomy has created an intellectual trap generating a debate

on validity of tradition as the accumulation of knowledge and progress as an ^{agent of} change from one state to another. This misconception about the relationship between tradition and progress is considered dangerous, as it has weakened the civilization.

02) The author uses historical examples to challenge the notion that progress requires abandoning the past. He is of the point of view that tradition is not merely a collection of wisdom of old generations but rather contains truths which they understood better than us. He believes that the denial of the wisdoms behind old practices is ignorance that disconnects humans from their roots, highlighting major past event such as the European Renaissance, religious movements and scientific revolutions.

03) The writer describes tradition as a living conversation instead of a static receipt of dead customs, because he believes that tradition connects humans to their roots by bridging today with

yesterday. He explains that, just by moving ahead in time, the problems of humanity don't change. When humans disconnect themselves from their past, they become rootless and weak, vulnerable to existing social problems.

04) The passage highlights how individuals search for identities, purpose, and the meaning of life in contemporary societies by consulting various specialised experts. They ignore the fact that tradition holds the answers to problems contributed by ancestors long ago. Thus, it should not be a blind adherence to certain traditional practices, but rather a rational and thoughtful approach to genuine innovation.

05) The author argues that distinguishing between valuable traditions and harmful ones requires real intelligence and judgement. I agree with the author that it is a challenging task to differentiate between both and requires intelligence and judgment to perform, especially

in contemporary era, since today's era is detached from its history and past, following baseless slogans without a deep understanding of the relationship between tradition and progress.
