4.1) WEAK economy preventing the long term goals from being planned



4.9) Weak national image preventing investor to invest owing to low investor confidence


The high cost of long term goals that can fulfill the needs in the longer run is not possible in isolation.



The local governments should be granted autonomy in finance, preventing any form of reliance on the broader sectors of administration.



The following measures can be adopted.

2.2) CLUSTER BASED SYSTEM ADOPTION

2.4) Redistribution of economy through the budget adjustments of subsidies


The circulation of economy back into the hands of the general people through the subsidies aid to give a room to breathe by uplifting the economic stress from their hearts.
