

GENERAL FEEDBACK FOR ESSAYS

Content (40%)

Your interpretation should be in depth, comprehensive and academic.

Always address the asked part. It should be evident in your outline, which should be self-explanatory in nature. Essays/Outlines that give related information without addressing the asked part do not qualify.

The whole essay should be relevant. Even if 1-2 arguments are irrelevant the essay will not pass.

Distribution of topic should be according to the demand of the topic statement i.e. if there is one scoring point it should be given more weight, if there are 2 or more scoring points all should be given equal weight.

All claims made in the essay must be substantiated. Out of 15-17 arguments at least 9-10 should be academically backed with proper references. The rest should be backed by either case studies or generally known information.

Evidence must be authentic and come from proper and authentic academic sources.

Newspapers do not qualify as an academic source. Illustrations and vague mentions of events do not qualify as academic evidence.

Essays that are lacking in evidence do not qualify.

LANGUAGE (25%)

Focus on enhancing your grammar as any essay with 4-5 grammatical mistakes does not pass.

Your essay must be in the tone and tense of the topic statements. Essays that fail to comply do not pass.

Your sentence structure should be simple, yet clear and diversified.

Vocabulary used should be simple, clear and concise. Expression should always be formal and academic.

You are never to write in 1st and 2nd person

Learn to number the outline properly. It should be in keywords and are used to identify the main points and sub-points.

Numbering for subheadings

STRUCTURE (20%)

Your essay must follow the selected pattern and that structure should be maintained throughout.

INTRODUCTION: The introduction is the longest paragraph of the essay, at least 200 words. It should start with a hook, must give the glimpse of what's to come and must have a thesis statement. Besides hook, your introduction should not have any sort of information and reference. Avoid definitions in introduction.


BODY PARAGRAPHS: Approximately 150 words at most and all the body paragraphs must be consistent in length. Should follow the proper structure of an academic paragraph i.e. it must have a topic sentence, supporting point, evidence and concluding sentence. The topic sentence and concluding sentence must align with each other. There should be no new information in the concluding sentence. One paragraph represents one subheading in the outline and consists of one idea.

CONCLUSION: Must start with the concluding phrase. There should be no new information in the conclusion. It should recap the arguments. Conclusion does not have any examples and information. If you are ending it on a hopeful note, remember that solutions and hope are not the same.

COHERENCE (15%)

There should be connectivity and flow between the paragraphs. Use proper connectors for this purpose not firstly, secondly, thirdly and so on. The sequencing of paragraphs must be logical. The essay must align with the outline in sequence, idea, and content. If not it will be deemed incoherent.

Unity of idea must be maintained within the paragraph, otherwise it will be considered incoherent.

~~First to fall, Pakistan had faced increasing threats to its security by proxies and non state actors. Although, Pakistan is facing security threat from its western border more seriously after emergence of new regime in Afghanistan of Taliban in 2021, the recent surge in terrorist attacks raise serious concerns and forced Pakistan to take big decision for future prosperity. Separatist organization BLA in Baluchistan did attack many military and public places by methods like suicide bombing and making public hostage. In Khyber Pakhtoon Khwa (KPK) experiences terrorist attacks by Jihadis organizations like TIP. An Attack on District Court in Islamabad shows intensifying terrorist operations. In 2025, BLA attack Jaffer express and killed innocent civilians. In G11, Islamabad, a suicide bomber~~

blows himself outside a district court resulting in 11 innocent deaths. These threats caused by TIP and BLA ~~are~~ have seen a rise in 2025. Proxies operated by India were verified in Afghanistan working against Pakistan. Non state actors also showed activeness against the well-being of Pakistan and the world which demands immediate policy making.

Secondly, floods during monsoon had done major economic and social destruction which have long lasting effects. After experiencing 2022 floods, Pakistan hadn't required fully, that in 2025, Pakistan faced more strong flooding in KPK, Punjab and Sindh. These flooding didn't just take hundred of lives but also destroyed people belongings and live stock. Damaging agriculture is another impact. In KPK, people faced catastrophic effect of flooding. In Punjab, agricultural sector ruined due to monsoon. In Sindh, people were forced to be displaced leaving behind their livestock and belongings. In Buner, KPK a strong cloud burst took 105 of lives of the village including 22 members of a same family. In Punjab, an economic shock experienced by government and

farmers, when agricultural sector which contributes 24% to GDP of Pakistan faced damages by floods. In Sindh, people became poor after flood destroyed their houses. These effects of monsoon floods in 2025 made economic and burden on Pakistan.

Thirdly, Pakistan had faced Afghanistan in military ^{grounds} ~~grounds~~ despite efforts for diplomatic relations. Afghanistan prosperity is important for Pakistan as it is for Afghanistan itself because of neighbouring border of 2250km. Instability and lawlessness in Afghanistan directly affects Pakistan. The recent surge in terrorist attacks were reportedly operated from Afghanistan by India's proxies. Afghanistan had historical incidents that led to both countries tense relations. Many efforts for ceasefire between two countries took place and revealed no fruit. India plan to use Afghanistan for its national interest raises concerns for Pakistan. Pakistan and Afghanistan had a history of tense relation regards to Afghan claim of Pakistan and claiming Durand line as unjustified. Three phases of dialogue between Pakistan and Afghanistan happened in Turkey which resulted in deadlock. Recent attacks on Pakistan like weapons used

Taliban Express incident were reported to be US weapons left by US Army in Afghanistan. These events had tensified relations which have not reached down.

Lastly, Pakistan faced serious issue of over-population which has reached 248 million in 2025. Generating resources for population exceeding multiple times the national treasure create serious social problems. 40% of population in Pakistan is below poverty line. This creates lawlessness, crime and conflicts over resources. In 2025, over population resulted in economic frustration, and social as well as ethnic conflicts. In Kasur, Punjab, a fruit seller killed two brothers over a conflict of just Rs 30. Similarly, in March, Sindh faced large protests over canal building in South Punjab. These protests resulted in one ~~casualty~~ casualty. These events promoted hatred against ethnicities because of limited resources and over-populated social segments. Over-population has become a time bomb which can burst at any time. Events like mentioned that happened in 2025 revealed the frustration caused by uncontrolled population.

Pakistan has had faced both positive and incidental turning points in 2025. The incorporation of AI in traffic system, Emergence of strong diplomatic relations, revival of PIA and retaliation against India's ~~retaliation~~ had positioned Pakistan in strong setting. However, issues in 2025 like climate change, Pak-Afghan war, International security still demand attention for proper and long lasting success of Pakistan.
