Despite the existence of much poverty and inequality, it would nevertheless be wrong to portray Pakistan as an unchanging society. Despite major failings of governance, economic growth during the past decade has resulted in the emergence of a youthful and dynamic middle class. According to some assessments, there are now as many as 35 million people with a per capita income of up to \$ 1900. There is no monolithic middle stratum of society; it is differentiated by occupation, income, family antecedents, language, and gender. The middle class contains both modernist and traditional elements and is, as a result, not necessarily more westernized in outlook and style than the urbanized younger generation drawn from the feudal elite. Indeed, one of the most striking developments of the past decade has been the spread of orthodox thinking among the youth. Perhaps the most unifying element of the middle class is consumerism as seen in the sales of cars, televisions and mobile phones. One in two Pakistanis is a mobile phone subscriber, one of the highest rates in the region. In addition to expenditure on electronic durables, the middle classes have establishments and privately run polyclinics which have become a marked feature of the urban landscape. According to one estimate, around three quarters of all the health care is provided by the private sector.
