- **Q. 3.** Examine whether Article 1 of the 1933 Montevideo Convention on the rights and duties of states is an accurate statement of the criteria of statehood in the modern context of international law
- **Q. 4.** Article 2(4) of the UN charter is an absolute prohibition of the use or threat of force. Analyse the validity of the statement in the light of writers' and states' approaches to interpreting the article
- **Q. 5.** International law is oxymoronic. Argue.
- **Q. 6.** Explain the rules that govern how an insurgency movement can become a subject of International Law.
- **Q. 7.** Give a detailed account of Recognition and its types. Describe how state and government recognition are different from each other.
- **Q. 8.** Write short notes on any **TWO** the following:
  - A) International Humanitarian Law
  - B) POWs in international law
  - C) Use of Force
