Q. No. 8 Make a Précis of the following passage and suggest a suitable title. (15+5=20 Marks)

One should also guard one's self from another possible misinterpretation. The fact that great art and profound thought are difficult to comprehend does not mean that simplified instruction in the humanities cannot be offered to beginners. On the contrary, wise introduction becomes the more necessary, just as is true in science. High-school pupils get something out of Julius Caesar, a reproduction in the classroom of Millet's "The Gleaners," a recording of "The Ride of the Valkyries," and Emerson's The American Scholar. But youth will never get beyond this "something" if these masterpieces are "taught" as if they did not differ from the latest Broadway comedy or television hit, the pictures in Look, a jazz record, and an inspirational message by some popular preacher. Introductory matter that never gets beyond introductions seldom leads to acquaintanceship. Complaint is made about science teaching in the secondary schools that textbooks have been so debased by the supposed demands of teaching that they are both obsolescent and unattractive; and it is to remedy this situation that, under a grant from the National Science Foundation, the Physical Science Study Committee is preparing textbooks in physics that will really introduce the beginning student to modern science and lead him to further study. Many beginning books in literature, the arts, the languages, and, in some ways, ethics and philosophy are like the physics books complained of. They lead nowhere. They assume that what is contemporary or novel must alone be true and lasting. Their emphasis is upon entertainment and pleasure rather than upon challenge and instruction. If we really seek in our public education to mature American youth, we shall make small progress in the humanities unless our elementary work leads into greatness and not into the merely contemporary. The contemporary fades every year; the problems of humanity continue.
