- **Q4**. Critically assess the theory of "social contract" as put forth by Hobbes, Locke, and Rousseau. Which of these thinkers provides the most practical and relevant framework for understanding the legitimacy of political authority in modern states?
- Q5. Evaluate the role of political parties and party systems in shaping democratic governance.

SECTION-B

- **Q6.** Examine the philosophical and practical differences between direct democracy and representative democracy. Which system offers a more effective means of ensuring political accountability and citizen participation in the modern world?
- **Q7**. Examine the evolution of federalism as a political system. Discuss how federal structures contribute to the balance of power between central and regional governments with special reference to Pakistan.
- **Q8**. Examine the relationship between democracy and capitalism. Is capitalism inherently supportive of democracy, or vice versa? Argue.
