Q No. 05 In what ways, Geneva Conventions have endeavoured to secure better treatment of wounded in armed conflicts, civilians and POWs? Describe in a brief manner.

Q No. 06 Elaborate variety of ways for pacific settlement of disputes in International Law.

Q No.07 The 1982 Convention on the Law of the Sea constitutes a comprehensive codification and development of contemporary International law governing the sea in times of peace. Explain this 1982 treaty in the context of the constitution of the oceans' which represents the result of an 'unprecedented, and so far never replicated, effort at codification and progressive development of international law'.
